Los Angeles County voters approved the Safe Neighborhood Parks tax measure in 1992. It provides about \$54 million a year for neighborhood and regional parks and recreation. That measure is about to expire—Proposition P is designed to preserve park and open space funding, through a \$23 annual parcel tax. **Proposition P will be on the November ballot.**

Come to the workshop to see the legacy of the previous measure and how Proposition P is structured to fund projects for:

- Parks and recreational facilities in park-poor areas
- Increasing park visits and physical activity
- Upgrading and maintaining neighborhood parks
- Employing and training local youth

- Water quality in rivers, creeks, lakes, and beaches
- Open space, hiking, biking and equestrian trails
- Cultural and arts facilities, museums and zoos
- Gang prevention
