Dear Mr. Chairman:

This is in further response to your letter of July 27, 2007, co-signed by Representative Bart Stupak, Chairman, Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, concerning decisions made by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA or the Agency), regarding the use of carbon monoxide (CO) in modified atmosphere packaging (MAP) for meat products and "tasteless smoke" (which includes CO) for fish.

We are providing additional documents responsive to request number three of your letter, which is re-stated below. Please be advised that these documents contain trade secret, commercial confidential or other information protected from public disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act (Title 5, <u>United States Code</u> [U.S.C.], section 552), the Trade Secrets Act (Title 18, U.S.C., section 1905) and/or FDA regulations. This information should not be published or otherwise made public. We would be glad to discuss the protected status of any specific information with you or your staff.

3. Please also provide all records relating to the determination that fish processed using "tasteless smoke" or carbon monoxide is GRAS.
