LEADERSHIP AT EVERY LEVEL: TO ENSURE THE EARTH'S VITALITY

The US Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Office of Research and Development (ORD) began a courageous journey in 1995 to prepare for the new millennium. This was to be a conversation of hope, discovering and dreaming together, and designing change efforts to generate the very best science to protect the American people. This presentation explains the rationale and results of using a strengths-based approach to culture change based on principles of Appreciative Inquiry.

Presenters will share their learning from the use of appreciative interviews, experiential learning activities, and two large-scale summits, which included voices from all parts of a 2000 person scientific and technical organization. You will see a behind the scenes view of how the organization's leadership paradigm was shifted from one of hierarchy to one which ignites leadership at all levels. You will also learn how managers accepted and embraced their role as catalysts for change. A case study on this work will be highlighted at the upcoming Second Global Forum for the Society for Organizational Learning.
