Army Installation Management Command seeking small businesses during June Industry Day event for cultural and natural resources management work

Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. --- Small businesses interested in serving as prime contractors for the U.S. Army Installation Management Command's (IMCOM) proposed cultural and natural resources environmental services contracts are invited to attend an Industry Day on June 3 - 4, 2008, at the Red Lion Hotel in Denver, Colo.

IMCOM is actively pursuing small business participation to address the cultural resources management support requirements, estimated at \$45M, and the natural resources management support requirements estimated at \$105M. Presentations at the Industry Day event will focus on the business capabilities that the government needs to support these Army environmental services requirements and include information about IMCOM's Strategic Sourcing initiatives. Opportunities for small businesses to attend one-on-one sessions with government representatives will be available, as will opportunities for the contractor community to discuss the performance work statements and acquisition goals.

The June Industry Day event is being held by IMCOM especially to reach companies in the Western United States with the opportunity to do cultural and natural resources work for the Army. Firms located in, but not limited to, California, Utah, New Mexico, Washington, Oregon, Nevada, Arizona are encouraged to attend.
