




Overview: Country program established 1986. Program focuses on agricultural sector, providing support primarily to producers and processors of consumables for the local and export markets. Current portfolio comprises **6 investment projects**, with a total current commitment of **\$1.1 million**.

Cooperative d'Achat de Produits et de Transformation (APT)	2002-2008	\$187,435	Food Processing (Peanut Products): APT, a 13-member cooperative, is meeting local demand for peanut oil and peanut butter. USADF funds are being used to procure new specialty equipment which improves the quality and quantity of outputs. Funds are also being used to improve packaging, all of which translates into increased revenues and member incomes.
Cooperative Pharmaceutique Biologique et Technique (COPHARBIOTEC)	2003-2008	\$245,457	Manufacturing (Analgesics): A local producer of analgesic baby syrup. USADF funds are being used to construct a production facility and to procure technical assistance, allowing COPHARBIOTEC to increase production and develop new markets, including wholesale, retail, physicians and consumers. This is translating into increased enterprise revenues and employee incomes.
ARTISAVON Cooperative	2005-2010	\$239,293	Manufacturing (Natural Soap Products): This 14-member cooperative produces export-quality, natural soap products. USADF funds are being used to expand and improve production which will enable ARTISAVON to compete in regional and international markets, resulting in higher sales revenues.
Coopérative des Vulgarisateurs du Soja et des Foyers Améliorés (CVSFEB)	2005-2010	\$247,898	Food Processing (Soy Products): This cooperative is engaged in the production and marketing of soy-based foods throughout Benin. The USADF investment is enabling CVSFEB to upgrade its production and transportation capabilities so that it can expand its share of domestic and regional export markets.
Union Communale des Associations des Femmes de Pobé (UCAF)	2005-2008	\$78,000	Food Processing (Palm Oil): An association of women's palm oil producer groups in the Pobé commune, UCAF is using USADF funds to strengthen its business management capabilities, conduct a regional market study, and to acquire improved palm oil processing equipment.
Union Communale des Associations des Femmes d'Adja-Ouere (UCAFA)	2005-2008	\$99,537	Food Processing (Cassava Flour): UCAFA is an association of women's groups that manufacture cassava flour or gari, a staple food in Benin, Nigeria and other neighboring countries. The association is using USADF funds to introduce new production technologies, conduct a regional market study, and acquire technical assistance to improve its operations and marketing.

Overview: Country program established **1989**. Program focus is on the development of small and medium-sized enterprises, particularly high potential eco-tourism projects. Program is strengthened through a strategic partnership with the Government of Botswana. Current portfolio comprises **12 investment projects**, including two cooperative agreements. Total commitment is **US\$2.046 million**.



Khama Rhino Sanctuary Trust Tourism (KRST)	2004-2009	\$285,911	Services (Eco-tourism): KRST generates revenues for three local communities with the tourism activities it manages on a 4,300 hectare wildlife sanctuary. USADF funds are being used to improve visitor facilities and services, which will generate higher tourism rates, leading to increased revenues and employment opportunities.
Pitsane Dairy Marketing Cooperative Society Ltd. (PDMC)	2005-2009	\$206,129	Food Processing (Dairy Products): Pitsane Dairy is a 44-member milk marketing cooperative based in the Barolong district. PDMC is using USADF funds to upgrade their equipment and facilities which will increase sales of superior quality milk products, helping to raise farmers incomes and create jobs.
San Arts & Crafts (SAAC)	2005-2010	\$218,208	Manufacturing (Traditional Arts & Handmade Home Décor): SAAC represents over 800 San artisans. USADF funds are being used to purchase needed equipment, acquire storage space and expand marketing activities. This will increase their operational capacity and improve the services provided to artisans.
Boasa Boapele Horticultural Marketing Cooperative (BBHMC)	2005-2009	\$204,781	Agriculture (Vegetable Farming): BBHMC is a marketing center representing crop producers in the Bobirwa district of central Botswana. USADF funds are being used to install cold storage facilities, thereby reducing loss due to spoilage, and to purchase refrigerated vehicles for transportation of produce to regional markets. In the first year of the investment alone, these improvements resulted in a increase of revenues from sales by 80%.
Chobe Enclave Conservation Trust (CECT)	2006-2008	\$84,880	Services (Eco-tourism): The communities around Chobe National Park, Chobe River basin, and Chobe Forest Reserve have formed CECT to expand and manage the tourism activities in these protected wildlife areas. In order to improve the revenue generating opportunities for these communities and develop a sustainable eco-tourism enterprise, CECT is using USADF funds to improve their operational capacity, update their management and financial systems, and create a long term business strategy for managing and preserving the natural beauty of the Chobe area.
Veld Products Research & Development Hoodia	2006-2008	\$94,916	Agriculture (Hoodia gordonii): Presented with a high potential demand from a multinational buyer for the hoodia gordonii plant, Veld Products will use USADF funds to expand the area currently under cultivation, improve planting techniques, and establish local grower support structures.
Botswelelo Centre (Thamaga Pottery)	2006-2008	\$88,056	Manufacturing (Ceramic Dinnerware): Thamaga Pottery is a community organization producing high quality dinnerware pieces used by Botswana's leading hotels. In an effort to better take advantage of regional and international opportunities for growth, Thamaga Pottery has solicited USADF assistance in improving their operational and management capacity.
Masa Semi-Precious Stones (Pty) Ltd	2006-2008	\$83,446	Mining & Extraction (Semi-precious Stones): Masa deals in the collection, cutting and polishing of locally available, semi-precious stones for export sales. With USADF funds being used to improve operational and management capabilities as well as to upgrade equipment and procure training and technical assistance, Masa will be in a strong position to make better use of future investment capital.

Motlhware Community Development Trust	2007-2009	\$94,456	Livestock (Goats and Sheep): Motlhware Trust is addressing the information gap that exists between small rural producers and the growing market for goat and sheep meat in urban areas. With USADF funds to support the formation of business and marketing plans, Motlhware Trust will grow their marketing service to reduce transaction costs for rural livestock farmers. By the end of the two year investment, Motlhware Trust aims to increase the sellers' income by more than 400% and quadruple the number of sellers involved.
Mmadinare Multipurpose Cooperative Society (MMCS)	2007-2008	\$76,396	Livestock (Dairy Products): Located in the town of Selebi-Phikwe, Mmadinare Multipurpose Cooperative Society is a unique dairy processing facility which not only purchases milk from its farmer members, but also has its own herd and dairy ranch which provides a steady supply of milk. MMCS will use USADF funds to improve its management capacity, upgrade its systems and develop a business plan to make it a viable candidate for a follow-on enterprise expansion investment.
Sankuyo Tshwaragano Management Trust (STMT)	2007-2012	\$246,838	Services (Eco-tourism): STMT manages the Santawani Eco-tourism Lodge, one of the oldest camps in Botswana. After receiving an EDI, STMT has been selected for an EEI grant to help secure a joint venture partner, Lodges of Botswana. USADF funds will support the trust in reconstructing and expanding the lodge facilities; this investment will be complimented by training and management assistance provided by Lodges of Botswana. With this expansion and new management, the community trust is anticipated to receive about Pula 900,000 in royalties and more than Pula 2.1 million in dividends in the next five years.

Tipografia Santos Printing Company	2005-2010	\$250,000	Services (Printing): Tipografia Santos is using USADF funds to update its equipment and expand working capital, allowing Tipografia to improve the quality and variety of printed products. This will in turn satisfy a demonstrated local need for high quality printed material and reduce dependency on imports.
Milot Hydroponics, Lda. (MHL)	2005-2010	\$229,630	Agriculture (Hydroponic Vegetables): A pioneer in the production and sale of hydroponic vegetables, MHL is using USADF funding to expand its operations. Assistance will provide for increased production, improved distribution networks and storage facilities that increase annual sales and create jobs.
Businesswomen's Agro-Industrial Association (DOCEL)	2005-2010	\$124,999	Food Processing (Jams): DOCEL is using USADF funds to complete and equip a jam processing facility and retail centre for the sale of jams and other foods produced by its members. This assistance will build social capital, generate income and create jobs for women in the poor Paul municipality.
Cooperative for Exporters of Refined Salt (MAIO)	2005-2008	\$89,993	Food Processing (Sea Salt): This village-level salt cooperative in Maio is using USADF funds to produce sea salt, procuring equipment to effectively double their annual production and lead to increased employment opportunities and higher wages.
Sociedade Ultramarina de Conservas, Lda. (SUCLA)	2006-2011	\$240,672	Food Processing (Canned Fish): SUCLA, the first fish cannery in Cape Verde, was established in 1931. SUCLA will use USADF funding to strengthen their technical, management and marketing capacity, allowing them to take advantage of market opportunities in Europe and the US and increase sales revenue.
Diallo & Macedo-Companhia de Navegação (D&M), Lda.	2006-2011	\$249,931	Services (Cargo & Passenger Ferry Services): D&M will use USADF funds to repair and maintain their cargo and passenger ferry service between the islands of Cape Verde. D&M will expand their operations, effectively resulting in increased net income and employee wages.
FIZALIS, Lda.	2006-2011	\$241,916	Food Processing (Fruit Juices): FIZALIS, a producer of fruit juices using imported fruit nectars is using USADF funding to improve its operational capacity and provide technical assistance. Funding provides opportunities to consolidate local markets for their products, increase net profits and improve employee wages.



Overview: Country program established 1986. Program focuses on social enterprises that provide primary services (water, education, health care), and agricultural enterprises that improve food security. Current portfolio comprised of **18 investment projects**. Total current commitment, including cooperative partner agreement, is valued at **\$3.4 million**. USADF has entered into a \$5-million strategic partnership with bauxite mining company Global Alumina to fund community development initiatives and to stimulate SME supply chain networks.


