Dear Mr. Priest:

Referencing our two previous correspondences to CITA (June 3, 2005 and March 7, 2007), we are amending our original request to CITA for the non-North American sourced tow and staple fiber of the types detailed below:

- 1) 3.0 denier (3.3 dtex) 100 kilotex uncrimped modacrylic tow HS# 5501.30
- 2) 3.0 denier (3.3 dtex) bright viscose rayon tow, HS# 5502.00.
- 3) 1.5 denier (1.7 dtex) bright viscose rayon tow, HS# 5502.00.
- 4) 3.0 denier (3.3 dtex) solution dyed black viscose rayon tow, HS# 5502.00
- 5) 3.0 denier (3.3 dtex) bright viscose rayon staple fiber, HS# 5504.10
- 6) 1.5 denier (1.7 dtex) bright viscose rayon staple fiber, HS# 5504.10

Currently, we are unable to source the above fibers from a NAFTA region that meet our specifications. Put simply, the above described materials are not manufactured in any form in North America. We have contacted the Canadian Consulate in Chicago and Bancomext, an arm of the Mexican government here in Chicago trying to source from within the NAFTA region in order to meet the NAFTA rule of origin, but this has not been fruitful.

Consistent with Section 7.2 of Annex 300-B of NAFTA, Cellusuede Products, Inc. requests that the Committee for the Implementation of Textile Agreements make a modification to the NAFTA rule of origin for textile flock of HS subheading 5601.30 to allow for the use of non-North American tow and staple fiber of the types detailed above.
