On behalf of the Task Force for Veterans' Entrepreneurship (VET-Force) and the many men and women who have served in our country's military, we would like to thank the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for its commitment to providing contracting and subcontracting opportunities to Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (SDVOBs). You have truly designed a model that other federal agencies should replicate.

Over the past three years, USDA has continued making progress towards attaining the minimum 3 percent goal, going from 0.69 percent in FY 05, to 0.85 percent in FY 06, to 2.4 percent in FY 07. This is a particularly noteworthy feat, since over half of the USDA's entire annual contracting budget is spent on agricultural food commodities (an industry with few SDVOBs currently participating). We are optimistic that USDA will meet or even exceed the 3 percent goal in FY 08.

This level of progress is a clear manifestation of what a large government agency can accomplish when their leaders visibly and tangibly communicate their support. While some agencies just talk about it, your exemplary approach to planning, monitoring, and measuring results through the use of a Scorecard along with having agencies submit individual Strategies and holding the layers of decision-makers accountable is actually getting it done.

We appreciate your hard work and proactive efforts to utilize USDA's contracting and subcontracting opportunities to grow SDVOBs. VET-Force looks forward to your continued commitment and support of this important initiative to help a group of people truly deserving of our nation's deepest respect and gratitude.
