United States v. Baby-Tenda Corporation, No. 05-CV-00907-ODS (W.D. Mo.)

On September 29, 2005, the United States filed suit in federal court in the Western District of Missouri against Baby-Tenda Corporation (aka Babee Tenda Corporation). The complaint seeks an injunction and other equitable relief against the defendant company. It alleges that some of defendant's distributors advertised their "safety seminars" using invitations and other materials that display the names or logos of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission and/or the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in such a way as to falsely imply that these government agencies sponsor or cosponsor the seminars. The United States amended its complaint on June 8, 2007.

Judge Ortrie D. Smith of Kansas City, Missouri, conducted a bench trial in this case on October 17-18, 2007. On November 7, 2007, Judge Smith entered "Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Judgment in Favor of Plaintiff, Declaring Defendant Violated 18 U.S.C. § 1341."
