◆ NASA Health Promotion and Wellness Team: The team ViTS was on December 3<sup>rd</sup> ViTS. Dr. Smallwood, KSC Deputy Medical Director reviewed the KSC Health and Fitness Initiative planned for February 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup>. The three keynote speakers will be broadcast on NASA Select at all Centers. The first quarter FY 2003 influenza immunization program has been going well at all Centers. Many Centers have offered the immunization outside of the clinic and the outreach efforts have been very successful in increasing participation. The upcoming quarterly promotion will focus on Ergonomics.

#### ♦ NIOSH Study Identifies Industries/ Occupations Prone to Chronic Lung Disease

A new NIOSH <u>study</u> identifies industries and occupations with an increased risk for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

◆ Occupational Hearing Loss Recordkeeping Issues Clarified: OSHA has <u>clarified</u> three matters in relation to the final rule issued last July on recording occupational hearing loss. The issues deal with 1) audiometric tests for workers in the shipbuilding industry, 2) the applicable baseline for computing a standard threshold shift, and 3) how OSHA will treat an expected increase in the number of recorded cases resulting from new recordkeeping definitions requirements.

◆ National Advisory Committee on Ergonomics: Secretary of Labor Elaine L. Chao announced on Dec 3, 2002 the selection of 15 individuals from industry, academia, labor, legal and the medical professions to form OSHA's National Advisory Committee on Ergonomics (NACE). The committee will advise the Assistant Secretary of Labor for Occupational Safety and Health on a number of issues related to OSHA's four-pronged approach to reducing ergonomic-related injuries in the workplace – guidelines, research, outreach and assistance, and enforcement. ◆ CDC Issues Handwashing Guideline: The October 2002 MMWR issued a Guideline for Hand Hygiene in Healthcare Settings. This is the Recommendation of the Healthcare Infection Control Practices Advisory Committee and Hand Hygiene Task Force. It can be found at:

◆ Occupational Health Program Metrics: Centers recently completed a Gap Analysis for Health Maintenance Examinations. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year the survey has been completed. The compliance with NASA issued Guidelines for Health Maintenance Examinations since FY 2001 has increased. For Complete Exams the compliance increased from 82% to 91% and Partial Exams increased from 84% to 92% between FY 2001 and FY 2003.
