The week began with Professional Development Courses for all Occupational Health disciplines. The Conference attendees saw a demonstration of the Indian Health Services (IHS) Electronic Health Record System. The demonstration by Dr. Martin of Computer Informatics Associates, Incorporated was accompanied by an overview of the changes needed to meet the occupational health functional requirements.
