A New Radiation Symbol: A new radiation warning

symbol, to supplement the existing trefoil symbol, has

been published by ISO as Standard #21482 -Ionizing-Radiation Warning—Supplementary Symbol. The trefoil symbol has no inherent meaning and only those people who have been educated in its meaning have knowledge that it represents the presence of ionizing radiation. The new symbol is the completion of a multiyear effort by the IAEA to develop a universal radiation warning symbol with the message of "Danger-Stay Away" that anyone anywhere will understand.
