♦ NASA's Chief Health and Medical Office Awarded American Astronautical Society Award:



On March 21, Dr. Richard S. Williams was awarded the <u>Melbourne W. Boynton Award</u>. This award was established in memory of Dr. Boynton, a flight surgeon

in the Army Air Corps in World War II, who devoted his career and gave his life in the development of flight safety and survival. In 1944, Dr. Boyton's life ended prematurely during a test involving a parachute jump. In recognition of Dr. Boynton's efforts in flight safety and survival, this award is conferred upon a physician who has made a significant contribution to the biomedical aspects of space flight.
