◆ 2008 HealthierYou Update: On October 1, the HealthierYou 2008 Campaign will launch. The Campaign components include the 2008 Health Calendar, Mayo Clinic EmbodyHealth Newsletter, and NASA's Annual Influenza Vaccination Drive.
