♦ NIOSH Draft Offers Interim Guidance on Medical Screening of Workers Potentially

Exposed to Engineered Nanoparticles: In December NIOSH issued interim guidance on the medical screening of workers potentially exposed to engineered nanoparticles in the manufacture and industrial use of nanomaterials. Since the topic has not been extensively discussed in the scientific literature, NIOSH has developed guidance to generate discussion, fill the current knowledge gap, and provide interim recommendations until further scientific information becomes available. Additionally, NIOSH is seeking comments on the strengths and weaknesses of exposure registries for workers potentially

exposed to engineered nanoparticles.
