

## Welfare Leavers Are Concentrated in Service and Clerical Jobs



Because welfare recipients tend to have less education and fewer skills than workers in general, they frequently move into jobs that require limited skill. As a result, former welfare recipients are concentrated in clerical/administrative and service jobs.
