



Program Summary

Indonesia's program is helping to reduce corruption in the judiciary, providing support for the Anti-Corruption Commission, enhancing the performance of the Financial Transaction Reports and Analysis Center, and developing pilot e-procurement systems in five provinces. The program is also helping Indonesia build a robust and sustainable immunization system in difficult to reach areas.

Program Highlights

- With technical support from the Threshold program, nearly 3,000 were children vaccinated with an additional dose of the measles vaccine as part of a measles immunization campaign in North Sumatra.
- A major breastfeeding campaign was conducted with the Indonesia Pediatric Association resulting in a gathering of over 1,500 mothers.
- With technical assistance from the Threshold program, Indonesia submitted a proposal to the Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization requesting funding to support health systems strengthening activities.
- Know-your-Customers training was provided to over 200 authorized money changers last quarter. Additionally, a public information campaign against money laundering was launched in Jakarta and Batam.
