DOE Coordination and Information Center (CIC)
The DOE CIC is a centralized repository of publicly releasable documents dealing with nuclear test-related fallout in off-site areas. Over 25,000 documents collected from over 100 agencies or individuals are available. The documents are indexed in a bibliographic data base containing titles, author names, dates, keywords, and abstracts (where included in the document). Microfiche hard-copy indexes by name, title, date, and keyword in context are available at the CIC and at selected research libraries across the country. Operated for DOE by the Reynolds Electrical & Engineering Co., Inc., CIC services to the public include orientation, indexes to the collection, reproduction of copies, and proxy research and data base searches. The mission of ATSDR, as an agency of the Public Health Service in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, is to prevent exposure and adverse human health effects and diminished quality of life associated with exposure to hazardous substances from waste sites, unplanned releases, and other sources of pollution present in the environment. HazDat, ATSDR's hazardous substance release/health-effects data base, is the scientific and administrative data base developed to provide access to information on the release of hazardous substances from Superfund sites or from emergency events and to information on the effects of hazardous substances on the health of human populations.
