The EHRS Project Update: The EHRS Project Team met with Medgate representatives for a Gap Analysis and Implementation meeting on August 4<sup>th</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup>. This meeting kicked off the planning, testing, and implementation processes, that will take approximately six months. Tom Beever, our Project Manager, is tasked with ensuring compliance with the NASA Office of the Chief Information Officer's (OCIO) project management requirements in NPR 7120.7. Dr. Christopher remains our Project Lead as we move through this important planning period. This is an exciting time as we develop our plans and milestones, begin to build base tables and reports, and explore the system's functionality for both medical and industrial hygiene. A teleconference for the Agency EHRS Task Force is being planned for September to bring all Centers up to speed on the implementation process. You may soon receive requests for input as we build the various tables and lists required to tailor the system to meet our specific needs. We still anticipate the first rollout at Stennis in February 2009.

To assist centers in meeting the requirements, a series of checklists for Infection Control, Environment of Care, Credentialing and Privileging, Medication Management, and Emergency Crash Cart are available on the NASA OH Website Policy page. Provider credentials files and clinical privileges should be current and available for review. Peer Review activities must also be performed for each provider (physicians and mid-level providers) to establish "current competency."
