

has in the past been involved in the financing of a stock by the name Computer Fields Expressway.

Informant stated that one JACK POURTNEY, an employee of 1st William Street Company, NYC, the underwriter of Computer Fields Expressway stock, went to RONALD ALPERT to find buyers for Computer Fields Expressway stock.

ALPERT came up with an investor by the name of JOE PARIS, who bought \$100,000.00 worth of Computer Fields Expressway stock, allegedly with money put up by CARLO GAMBINO, FRANK SINATRA, and JILLY RIZZO. This stock was bought through the 1st William Street Company, New York City.

- Subsequently, the value of Computer Fields Expressway stock dropped, and the \$100,000.00 investment was lost.

RONALD ALPERT, the victim, has been interviewed and has refused to cooperate.

On 2/23/71, Chief Assistant United States Attorney ROBERT MORVELLO, Southern District of New York, New York City, was advised of the facts in this case, and is familiar with several of the captioned subjects.


On 2/25/71, ROBERT MORVELLO advised that this case would necessitate the issuance of subpoenas to the captioned subjects, and in this regard he issued a subpoena for RONALD ALPERT to appear before a Federal Grand Jury, SDNY, on 3/4/71, at 10:00 a.m., to testify and give evidence in regard to an alleged violation of Section 371, Title 18, United States Code.

This subpoens was served on ALPERT on 3/2/71, Per Bureau authority.

On 3/4/71, AUSA MORVELLO advised that ALPERT did not appear before the Federal Grand Jury on 3/4/71, as scheduled. MORVELLO advised he is presently talking with ALPERT's attorney regarding ALPERT's failure to appear before this Grand Jury.

AUSA MORVELLO has advised he would prefer having Bureau Agents serve subpoenes on all captioned subjects in the near future as he wants these subjects interviewed as an aid in inducing their cooperation; therefore, UACB, Bureau Agents will serve subpoenes on captioned subjects when deemed appropriate.

It is noted that of the aforementioned subjects, CARLO GAMBINO, ANIELLO DELLACROCE, JCSEPH LUCCO PAGANO, GUISEPPO GALLO, Jr., ANTHONY CARILLO, and MICHAEL MAIONE have been identified as members of La Cosa Nostra.

ANTHONY CARILLO has been identified as a "capo" in the GENOVESE "family" of LCN,

MICHAEL MAIONE has been identified as a member of the GENOVESE "family" of LCN.

FRANK GUGLIELMINI has been identified as a member of the GAMBINO "family" of LCN.

JACK POURTNEY, the President of 1st William Street Corporation, NYC, the underwriter of Computer Fields Expressway stock requested RONALD ALPERTS assistance in finding buyers for this stock.

ALPERT was able to come up with an investor by the name of JOE PARIS, who bought \$100,000 worth of Computer Fields Expressway stock.




JOE PARIS claimed to be a relative of CARLO GAMBINO, and the money which JOE PARIS invested in Computer Fields Expressway stock allegedly was put up by CARLO GAMBINO, FRANK SINATRA and JILLY RIZZO.

After JOE PARIS invested the money, Computer Fields Expressway stock began losing value allegedly because JACK POURTNEY was stealing assets from the underwriter company, the 1st William Street Corporation. In a short time the value of Computer Fields Expressway stock dropped from \$12.00 a share to \$.75 a share.

On 3/31/71, LOIS YOHONN, Attorney, Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Federal Building, 26 Federal Plaza, NY, NY, advised the SEC is familiar with several stockbrokers who have been involved in an attempted manipulation of Computer Fields Expressway stock.

YOHONN advised the SEC would furnish AUSA MORVELLO with the germane records of the Computer Fields Expressway stock which would aid in establishing the violation in this matter. YOHONN stated that JACK POURTNEY, the President of 1st William Street Corporation, NYC, has been cooperating with the SEC on this matter.





I told McKee that someone had written to Walter minchell stating that the FBI is supposed to be investigating a report that Sinatra had paid, through his manager, \$40,000 to obtain a 4-F classification. One of the doctors who conducted Sinatra's physical examination is reported to have "talked too much" in a beer parlor. A former schoolmate of Sinatra's from Highland, New Jersey is also reported as saying that Sinatra has no more ear drum trouble than General McArthur. This anonymous informant also wrote in his letter to Winchell that mothers around that section who have sons in the service are planning a petition to President Roosevelt asking for a re-examination of Sinatra by a neutral board of examiners.

I asked SAC McKee to asceptain definitely whether Sinatra's classification was 4-F and if so, to determine why he received this classification. However, I told him that it would not be necessary at this time to make a full scale investigation or to look into the charges of \$40,000 being paid the examining doctors at Newark. McKee stated that he would do this immediately and advise the Bureau of the results.

Reference is made to the telephone message from Mr. Christopher Callan at the Seat of Government on February 8, 1944 concerning the receipt by the Bureau of an anonymous letter alleging, in effect, that \$40,000 had been paid to the doctors who examined FRANK ALBERT SINATRA and thereafter gave an opinion that SINATRA had a perforated eardrum and was unsuitable for military service.

In accordance with instructions, the investigation was limited to an examination of SINATRA's Selective Service File in order to obtain from that file certain information as set forth below. On February 9, 1944, the file was examined by Special Agent at Local Draft Board #19 for Hudson County, Room 308, 26 Journal Square, Jersey City, New Jersey. The Chief Clerk of this board is Mrs. MAE E. JONES.

This statement was supported by the typewritten name, "R. G. WALLS, Captain, Infantry". The certification and statement carried the place and date of Newark, New Jersey, December 9, 1943.

More detailed notations appeared in Section 4, "Physical Examination Results", as follows:

"40. EAR, NOSE, THROAT ABNORMALITIES: Chronic perforation . 1t. drum. Hist of repeated discharge from ear - mastoid areas show coating in remaining cells and deformity of canal. Marks sclerosis in mastoid area."

"50. MUSCOLOSKELEAL DEFECTS: Fracture deformity 3rd finger rt. N.D."

"55. MENTAL: Emotional instability. N.D."

"64. HEIGHT: 67½ inches."

"65. WEIGHT: 119 lbs."

"75. BLOOD PRESSURE: (a) Systolic: 122; (b) Diastolic: 78."

(3) GENERAL APPEARANCE OF FILE, ETC.: On its face, the file appeared to be in regular order. Mrs. Jones said that the Local Board had been particularly careful not to afford SINATRA special treatment and where any question of importance arose, the Board would immediately communicate with the State Headquarters for advice in view of the "position" held by SINATRA. Mrs. Jones also said that although it had been reported over the radio and otherwise that SINATRA had had a pre-induction physical examination and knew two weeks before the date set for his induction examination that he would be rejected, no such preinduction examination was ever given by her board for any registrant. It had been the impression of Mrs. Jones that SINATRA had had the belief that he would be rejected inasmuch as he had continued to make plans for his new radio show, but she had readily explained that to herself through the thought that he had probably had his own physician examine him.

The following inconsistencies appeared in the file: In his Selective Service Questionnaire executed December 17, 1940, under series 2, "Physical Condition", SINATRA wrote in under "Have No" -"To the best of my knowledge, I have no physical or mental defects or diseases." In an undated Current Selective Service Questionnaire which Letter to the Director JLD:vml

was to be returned prior to November 7, 1941 and in answer to the question, "Do you have any physical or mental defects or diseases?", SINATRA wrote "No". On October 22, 1943, in the "Extract for D.S.S. Form #221 - Report of Physical Examination and Induction", SINATRA answered Question #5, "What Physical or Mental Defects or Diseases Have You Had in the Past, if any?", by the one word, "No". In answer to Question #6, "Have you ever been treated at an institution, sanitarium or asylum?", SINATRA wrote, "No". On October 22, 1943, Local Board Examining Physican A. POVALSKI, M.D., Jersey City, found that SINATRA had none of the defects set forth in Parts 1 or 2 of the List of Defects (form #220).

Independently of this investigation, it had come to 170 the attention of Special Agent that FRANK SINATRA had a criminal record in Bergen County. From Bergen County Jail, Hackensack, New Jersey, there was obtained an enclosed picture of FRANK SINATRA and the following information regarding the two occasions on which SINATRA was held in the Bergen County Jail: FRANK SINATRA, Arrest #42799, Bergen County Sheriff's Office, Hackensack, New Jersey was arrested on November 26, 1938 charged with Seduction. Disposition was marked, "Dismissed". FRANK SINATRA, Arrest #42977, was arrested on December 22, 1938, charged with Adultery. The disposition on this charge was not listed. Stated that the fingerprints taken at the time of the listed arrests were submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D. C.

Room SAC McKee of the Newark Office advised that Sinatra's Mr. Nease classification appeared to be regular and that he was disqualified Miss Beahm because of a perforated ear drum and chronic mastoiditis and that his mental condition was one of emotional instability. McKee stated Miss Gandy that in a prior physical examination in the fall of 1943 none of these defects were noted and that in a questionnaire dated December 17, 1940, in answer. to a question as to his physical condition, Sinatra noted there were none to the best of his knowledge. He is classified 4-F as of December 11, 1943.

McKee also said it had come to the attention of one of the Resident Agents at Hackensack, New Jersey, that Sinatra has an arrest record and that Hackensack County Jail, who furnished this information, gave the Agent a photograph of Sinatra, arrest #42799. McKee advised that Sinatra was arrested in 1938 on a charge of seduction which was dismissed and he was later arrested on a charge of adultery. **FOR VICTORY**

I instructed McKee not to take any further action in this matter. He sai ve. he would submit a letter today covering the above.



Reference is made to the two letters from this office. dated February 10, 1944 and February 17, 1944, and to telephone message from Mr. CHRISTOPHER CALLAN on February 21, 1944. In accordance with instructions given by Mr. CALLAN, JOSEPH R. WEINTROB, Captain, U. S. Army Medical Corps, Chief Medical Officer, Armed Forces Induction Station, 113th Infantry Armory, Sussex Avenue and Jay Street, Newark 4, New Jersey, was interviewed by Special Agent on February 23, 1944. The line officer in command of this induction station is Captain RAYMOND E. WALLS. Captain WEINTROB'S superior is Major FRANK GUIDOTTI, 39 Whitehall Street, -New York, N.Y.

Captain WEINTROB said that he had personally examined SINATRA'S cars and had rejected SINATRA against his, WEINTROB'S, wishes on the basis of a perforation of the left tympanum and chronic mastoiditis. left, either one of which would have sufficed for having rejected the registrant. The rejection was based on Mobilization Regulation #1-9, War Department, Washington, D. C., issued October 15, 1942 and amended thereafter. These regulations entitled "Standards of Physical Examination during Mobilization" set forth under Section 5, "Ears", paragraph #25, that the following defects make a registrant "not acceptable":

> (C) Perforation membrana tympani Acute or chronic mastoiditis

Letter to Director

In explanation of some of the medical terms used above, and in explanation of the material transmitted to Colonel WALSON by Captain WEINTROB, the latter gave the following information:

SINATRA had stated to him that he had had at bast three mastoid operations in his youth. If SINATRA mentioned the name or names of the physicians involved, Captain WEINTROB was unable to recall them. The examination, eccording to Captain WEINTROB, seemed to verify the statement inasmuch as there were found scars behind the ear. The perforation of the drum (tympanum) was a disease perforation so far as Captain WEINTROB could tell and not the result of an incision by human hands. Captain WEINTROB stated that mastoiditis is ordinarily caused by infection of the middle ear. In SINATEA'S case, there was chronic infection of the middle ear. Such infection ordinarily causes the formation of puss, which may seek outlet through the drum causing a perforation and thereafter puss draining or running through the perforation. The puss may stop flowing in which case the perforation of the drum will ordinarily heal over until puss again causes a perforation. However, where a perforation has healed, it is possible to see that a perforation formerly existed at that spot. The diseased middle ear can spread this infection to the brain causing an abscess, or to the mastoid area. In the latter area, a diseased condition is termed "mastoiditis" which may be acute; that is inflammed, or chronic; that is more a case of a hardening of the mastoid area with the laying down of bone deposits. In adverse weather conditions and the like chronic mastoiditis may well develop into acute mastoiditis. In SINATRA'S case, his assertion that "running ear" had recently occurred was borm out by the parforation noted in the x-ray of the mastoid area, which showed that the condition was one of chronic mastoiditis. This was borne out by the eppearance on the x-ray of the scelorizing or hardening of that area; that is clotting in the remaining cells of the mastoid area not removed by operations indicating that the chronic mastoiditis had had the effect of petrifying that portion of the head. Captain WEINTROB attempted to locate the x-rays of the mastoid area, but was unable to do so immediately. He said he would continue to search for them and would lay them one side if he were able to locate them.

The Captain also stated that no one had ever attempted to influence his opinion in this case and in fact no one had discussed the SINATRA case with him prior to the actual examination. He added that within the past few weeks he has read an article by one of the New York City columnists to the effect that it was understood FRANK SINATRA'S case was not yet closed so far as induction was concerned. Captain WEINTROB stated he was satisfied in his own mind that SINATRA should not have been inducted and was willing to stake his medical reputation on his findings. He pointed to his training at the Jefferson Medical School and post-graduate work at the University of Pennsylvania Medical School as an indication of his medical qualifications.

Letter to Director

Captain WEINTROB stated that although SINATRA was four pounds below the minimum weight for men of his height, his induction station no longer went by the rules regarding minimum weight and for that reason no mention was made of his being below minimum weight. He also stated that many men coming into the induction station are found to have known physical defects which they did not list on the questionnaire or other draft papers. Ordinarily they fail to list such defects in their draft records for fear that people will criticize them for attempting to evade the draft in that fashion.

at the Armed Forces Induction Station above mentioned, was likewise interviewed inasmuch as he had examined the x-rays of the mastoid area of FRANK SINATRA. whose residence and office address is stated that the x-rays indicated to him that SINATRA had chronic mastoiditis. He explained that the marked solerosis or hardening of that area made that statement necessary. It ikewise indicated that he was certain that it was absolutely necessary to reject SINATRA in the induction.

You will recall that we inquired into the Selective Service status of Frank Sinatra because of the receipt from Walter Winchell of an anonymous letter which he received alleging that \$40,000 had been paid by Sinatra to procure a 4-F classification. Newark found that Sinatra received a 4-F classification because of an ear ailment. It also discovered that Sinatra had been arrested twice--once for seduction and once for adultery, both arrests resulting in dismissals, and both based on same act.

The Director penned a notation on my memorandum to you dated February 15, 1944, "We should be certain that there is nothing irregular in this case," and upon your instructions, I called the Newark Office on February 21, 1944 at 4:45 p. m. and instructed ASAC R. W. Bachman to have the physician who examined Sinatra interviewed. The Newark Office has complied with these instructions and there is attached hereto Newark's letter of February 24, 1944 which indicates very definitely that Sinatra was properly rejected because of a perforation of the membrana tympani and acute or chronic mastoiditis. During the course of the interview, it was ascertained from the examining physician, Dr. Joseph R. Weintrob, Captain. U. S. Army, Medical Corps, that Sinatra stated he had, in his early youth, been operated on on several occasions for mastoiditis. X-ray pictures have borne out Sinatra's statements in this regard. Captain Weintrob said the scar tissue which was the result of the operation was readily perceptible and in this connection the operational scars very clearly appear on the left profile photograph taken on the occasion of one of Sinatra's arrests by the Sheriff's Office at Hackensack, New Jersey. Either the perforation of the tympani or the mastoid condition is, as Captain Weintrob points out, cause for rejection of a registrant under War Department regulations.

It therefore appears that Sinatra was properly rejected from military service and there is no indication that the statements made in the anonymous letter above referred to have any foundation. Consequently, in the absence of further instructions, no additional inquiries will be conducted in this matter.



Grand Central Palace was the hig store of the draft, the plant in which "all the different groups" as Riemor the Great, with lofty objectivity, refers to the lower orders of the human race, were stripped to nakedness and, in this dignified condition, answered freedom's call.

"I suppose it was a little too early in the morning or maybe he didn't like to ride the subway, have he didn't go with us, but arrived at the like later on. As we sat in the auditorium and we being briefed on what was to come, it was only natural the fellows were trying to pick Danny Kaye out. Which they finally did. Although it wasn't a laughing Danny we saw. He gave no response to guys hollering out his name. He seemed very annoyed and just sat motionless.

"A BOUT three-quarters of the way through is
"A when I next spotted him. I hardly recognized him. He had had his shoulders on—that is
to say a well-padded suit, etc., but now we were
all stripped to our shorts. There was about three
other fellows in front of me waiting for the next
doctor.

"And here was Danny Kaye, putting on probably his best performance yet.

"The doc would tell him to bend from the waist. As he did this he gave out with a cry and immediately straightened up as if to say it was impossible to do."

[DOSSIBLY that is what his Local Board,

No. 229, had in mind when it rejected unanimously a request from the U.S.O. that Danny be permitted to go out as an entertainer and insisted that he would go in a soldier suit or not at all.

The board wrote: "Neither his physical nor his mental condition or attitude tends to show that the morale of the armed forces would be benefitted by his performance before them as a civilian."

"He then commenced to explain something to the doc," says Danny's old buddy of somewhat less than an hour in the war against the savage barbarian hordes for the preservation of human liberty. "After which the doc pressed his back with his fingers but only to hear Danny sigh again. By this time, another doctor came over and started examining the

over and started examining us. A "Soon after, I was through with that section and started to move on when I got my last glance at "The Kid From Brooklyn." He was attempting a knee bend, but had lost his balance unrealistically. If this was his talent that was

supposed to have lifted our morale overseas. I was glad I never heard or saw of him while in the service."

WELL, that is the way it goes in the roughwand-ready banter of fighting men. This chap went on to do his bit in the dumb crude way of "all the different groups," but Danny went to Furt Jay for some careful checking and the word came back which caused his local board to comment on his "mental attitude."

And, after a while Danny's whole draft file vanished permanently from the jurisdiction of the boards and he devoted himself unmelested to esthetic works. He is most esthetic when he plays blubber-lip and emits a highly spiritual sound something like the dreeling of a committed idiot in a lunatic asylum.

Like Frankie Boy Sinatra, another ferocious, though vicarious fighter against the bloody-handed Hun, Danny Kaye was denied his chance to visit the sones of war until they were mere tourist areas. Like Frankie Boy, also, he developed aggressive social and political ideas.

Frankie Boy gave \$7,500 to Roosevelt's fourth campaign fund and developed a case of 4F eardrum, but he came right to the water's edge, in New York, in May, 1946, only a year after stended, and fearlessly denounced double-talking diplomats at a show under the suspices of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts and Sciences.

If you want to know how many times this committee has been cited as a front by the Dies and Thomas committees in official reports to Congress, you will just have to look it up yourself.

However, Frankie Boy's manager, George Evans, says that thereafter he put himself under the political guidance of two reporters who are experts on Communism, and agreed not to mess around with any outfit which they disapproved. It shows Frankie Boy's wonderful political grasp and wisdom.

A BOUT the same time, Frankle Boy snarled in menacingly at Ashton Stevens, of the Chicago Herald-American, who is rising 80 years, because Mr. Stevens had called his bobby-soxers "morons."

Frankle spoke very affectionately and protectively about his beloved little blabbity-babs, as Danny Kaye would call them. He regards them as innocent American girlhood, but, by a curious difference of opinion, Mr. Stevens thinks of them as several million sexually excited specimens of jail-batt.

Mr. Stevens adds that Frankie Boy is always on guard to protect his precious name because when the little morous seem to be wanting nothing but his autograph, actually, they are "trying to tear his clothes off."

Sordid, isn't H? But that's His.

DANNY KAYE was one of those glamorous gods of the unreal world of romantic enchantment who flew to Washington to protest against the undemocratic procedure of the United States Congress in proving that certain Hollywood Communists were Communists.

Back in his beginning days he made comical faces and went "blabbity-blibbety-blub" in a show produced under the political auspices of the

New Masses.

It is too near closing time for me to try to explain to you the politics of the New Masses.
But if you go out and bet the rent that it is anti-Joe Stalin, you are shot with Juck. G'bye new!

On January 16, 1963, FRANK SINATRA and MILTON A, RUDIN, Attorney at Law and Financial Advisor to SINATRA, were interviewed at the offices of Essex Productions, 9229 Sunset Boulevard, Suite 512, Los Angeles, California, concerning the Cal - Neva Lodge, Crystal Bay, Nevada.

During the course of this interview Mr. RUDIN, with the consent of Mr. SINATRA, advised that their current plans for the Cal - Neva Lodge included quite a substantial expansion of the hotel which would necessitate the bringing in of some \$4,000,000.00 of added capital. RUDIN' stated that he found out by checking into the loan situation that banks and insurance companies, in order to make loans, would ask for stock options, which they are not ready to agree to.

Mr. RUDIN advised that he has become familiar with some of the pension fund loans from reading the series of articles run by the "Ios Angeles Times" on investigations of loans by the Teamsters to various Nevada casinos and that these are straight forward loans. He advised that he had gone to Chicago and had talked to various Teamster officials in the Chicago area concerning the possibility of securing a loan for Cal - Neva. He advised that the Cal - Neva, at the next meeting of the trustees for the pension fund in March, will, according to their present plans, apply for a loan in order to achieve their expansion program.

Both RUDIN and SINATRA advised they wished to go on record that there were no under-the-table payments of any kind involved, that this was a simple straight forward

business transaction with sufficient collateral involved. Mr. RUDIN advised that the person he had pontacted regarding the possibility of such a loan was HAROLD GIBBONS. SINATRA mentioned that DORIS DAY had secured a similar type loan from the Teamsters for a motel that she owns, and he had asked her if she had had to cut anybody in, and she advised him that it was not necessary, that it was a straight loan.

A review of the minutes of a meeting held on September 21, 1962, by the Trustees of the Central States, Southeast and Southwest Areas, Pension Fund of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters revealed the following pertinent information:

Mr. Milton A. Ruden appeared before the Trustees on behalf of Park Lake Enterprises, Incorporated, Cal-Nova Lodge, Nevada.

The borrower was seeking an immediate loan of \$3,000,000 with an additional commitment for \$2,000,000. This loan was to be used for the purpose of developing the resort.

Trustee James R. Hoffa summarized the application as follows:

The request for the loan was on Park Lake Enterprises, Cal-Nova Lodge, Nevada, for a \$3,000,000 present loan with an additional commitment of \$2,000,000. Hoffa asked Ruden to explain the application.

Mr. Ruden advised the Trustees that Mr. Frank Sinatra was the principal stockholder of the corporation. Cal-Nova had been operated for 30 years at Lake Tahoe. Sinatra had acquired majority control over the past two years and started an expansion program without permanent financing.

Ruden detailed the application and said they were asking for \$5,000,000 with the understanding that the additional \$2,000,000 which would be only 60% of the applicant's actual cash was additional investment in additional construction.

In response to a question asked by Trustee Albert Matheson, Ruden stated that Sinatra and others will have \$540,000 plus some monies they have loaned in, namely, a quarter million dollars from various companies.

Ruden continued that it was their intention to put other Sinatra ventures into this which would supply income and additional capitalization rather than put in tax paid dollars. Ruden also stated that if the Fund put \$5,000,000 into this project the property would then be worth from \$8,000,000 to \$10,000,000.

A motion was made by Trustee Frank Fitzsimmons that the loan be rejected on the basis presented and "that the man come in" and give a definite presentation for a future request on the actualities of what is going to be entailed in his request for money.

The motion which was seconded by Trustee John Spickerman was carried with dissent.

After the vote, Hoffa who was acting as chairman, advised Ruden as follows:

"The committee has rejected the presentation presented today and recommends that you present at the next meeting here, more concise program - namely, exactly how much money you are going to spend, how much money you are



The National Transportation Safety Board said today that the crash of a chartered jet which killed four persons, including the mother of entertainer Frank Sinatra, was caused by the crew's failure to properly interpret their flight clearance.

The plane, a Gates Learjet 24B, operated by Jet Avia Ltd., took off at 1655:00½ on January 6, 1977 from runway 30 at Palm Springs Municipal Airport, California on an Instrument Flight Rules clearance to Las Vegas, Nevada. About five minutes later the Learjet crashed in the mountains at approximately 9,700 feet altitude some 22 miles northwest of Palm Springs. The local weather observation reported a ceiling estimated at 3,000 feet, broken, 5,000 feet overcast, visibility 8 miles, light rain, wind calm.

The jet's air traffic control clearance required it to make a right turn after takeoff and position itself on a straight line course between Palm Springs and Twenty-nine Palms. The jet was to maintain an altitude of 9,000 feet and was told to report "crossing" the Palm Springs VORTAC²/051 degree radial 10 mile fix.

The Board's investigation showed the plane took off, climbed to 9,000 feet, but never changed its runway heading and flew directly into the mountains, killed the two-man crew, and two passengers, 82-year-old Mrs. Natalie Sinatra, and her traveling companion.

"The National Transportation Safety Board determines the probable cause of the accident was the flightcrew's misinterpretation of an instrument flight rules clearance issued by the Palm Springs Departure Control and subsequent Air Traffic Control instructions.

"Contributing to the accident was the controller's failure to detect the aircraft's deviation from the route of flight contained in the ATC clearance and the flightcrew's failure to recognize their proximity to the high terrain."

At 1654:10 the FAA local controller cleared the Learjet for takeoff and to maintain "niner thousand." After the aircraft was airborne
the crew contacted Palm Springs departure control and reported "out
of" 1,500 feet and climbing to 9,000 and the controller requested they
report reaching 9,000. The controller then requested the flight to
"report crossing 051 radial 10 mile fix." The flight responded "okay"
and ten seconds later the controller transmitted "and that's the Palm
Springs 051 radial, sir," and again the flight responded "okay."

Subsequently, at 1656:25 the Learjet crew reported they had "crossed the radial." The crew did not specify the "Palm Springs 051 degree radial" or the "10 mile fix," both of which were included in the clearance. The Board said that the flightcrew's report that they had crossed the radial "was erroneous" because the Palm Springs 051 degree radial exists in the northeast quadrant of the VORTAC and the flight never entered that area. The Board concluded that when the crew reported they had crossed the radial they were actually crossing the Palm Springs 231 degree radial which is the reciprocal course of the Palm Springs 051 radial. At the same time when the controller received this report he "assumed" that the crew were crossing the Palm Springs 051 radial at the 10 mile fix, as specified in the clearance.

The Board said it is difficult to rationalize how the flightcrew concluded that the runway heading of 300 degrees -- which led them from the point of takeoff directly into the mountains -- was to be maintained. The Palm Springs controller cleared the flight, in part, to Las Vegas "via Palm Springs, direct Twenty-nine Palms." Based on the existing regulations the Board concluded that the pilot was required to fly on the straight line course between these two points, which meant turning off the 300 degree runway heading as soon as practical after takeoff. The controller had specifically defined the point at which the Learjet was to report along its cleared route; crossing the Palm Springs 051 degree radial "10 mile fix." There was no way this fix could be reached by maintaining the runway heading," the Board said, "and no request was levied on the flightcrew to hold runway heading after takeoff."

The Board noted that one possible explanation for the crew's misinterpretation of their clearance could have been that the crew were unaware they were operating in non-radar environment and believed they were under radar control. However, at the time of the accident the Palm Springs Tower had no radar capability. Consequently, until the Learjet reached about 9,000 feet -- the lowest altitude that the Los Angeles Center radar could pick up its transponder target -- no radar information was available to monitor the Learjet's progress. It was not until "just before impact" that the Los Angeles Center's radar picked up the Learjet on their radarscope but there was not sufficient time to establish radio contact with the flight and vector it away from the mountain. Thus, without radar, the Palm Springs departure

controller's knowledge of the Learjet's position could only have been based on the route for which he cleared the aircraft -- and the pilot's progress reports.

In commenting on the flightcrew's "failure to recognize their proximity to high terrain," the Board pointed out that "proper exercise of responsibility" during descents and takeoffs can only be based on knowledge of terrain hazards. However, in this case, the pilot was familiar with the Palm Springs airport and its surrounding terrain. Thus, the Board said, it could not explain the Learjet pilot's continuance of a heading that, if maintained would aim his aircraft toward the highest mountain in the area and at an altitude more than 2,000 feet "below" the highest terrain. The Board did note, however, that several aircraft accident investigations have indicated that, since the advent of radar control and its capability to vector traffic, there has been "a derogation of pilot knowledge of terrain over which they fly."

In commenting on the controller's failure to detect the aircraft's deviation from the route contained in the air traffic control clearance the Board noted that at 1656:55 the Learjet crew reported they were approaching 9,000 feet and asked if they were cleared "via" the 051 degree radial to Twenty-nine Palms. The controller replied in the affirmative and added "I had a change of route there. Maintain 9,000, I'll keep you advised." The crew then asked if they were to maintain 9,000 feet "straight ahead, right?" and the controller said they were. The controller's use of "I had a change of route there" appeared to confirm their belief that their present heading (approximately 300 degrees) was to be maintained until they received clearance to "turn back" toward Twenty-nine Palms and "intercept" the 051 radial.

On the other hand the controller stated that when he said he would "keep them advised" he was only considering the "altitude restriction" of 9,000 feet. Moreover, since the controller was convinced the flight was already established outbound on the 051 radial course the query about flying "straight ahead" merely meant "continued flight" toward Twenty-nine Palms on the 051 radial. The Board noted that during this exchange the flightcrew did not apprise the controller of one vital piece of information -- their heading, or direction of flight.

Subsequently, at 1658:30 the crew reported they were about 14 miles from Palm Springs and maintaining 9,000 feet on a heading of "three one zero (310 degrees)" and asked "what's our clearance from here." This was the only transmission from the flightcrew that gave the controller "heading information" the Board said, and a chance to make a reasonably accurate estimate of the aircraft's position. However, the Board said, the controller did not recognize the significance of the 310 degree heading or it did not register with sufficient impact to overturn his conviction

that the Learjet was on the 051 radial heading and proceeding toward Twenty-nine Palms.

The same defects in communication procedures uncovered in this accident appeared in several earlier accidents, the Board said. As a result, on July 25, 1977, the Board recommended that the Federal Aviation Administration require a controller who issues an altitude assignment, or a heading, to require the crew to read back the clearance -- if the pilot fails to do so on his own. The Board also recommended that the FAA alert its personnel to the circumstances surrounding the Palm Springs accident in an effort to prevent any possible recurrence.

On January 24, 1979, Departmental Attorneys Cecilia Hatfield and Herbert Lyons, Chief Torts Branch, Civil Division, arrived in Las Vegas, Nevada, and met with Supervisor Robert M. Bryant and Special Agent Michael T. Hanley. During the above meeting, a request was made by Hatfield to analyze business, books and records made available by Jet Avia, Ltd., on January 25, 1979, and make a determination of which records would require detailed examination. The detailed examination is required to determine the correctness and accuracy of the civil claim against the Government regarding lease agreement with Jet Avia and the loss of use of the aircraft.

On January 25, 1979, the above analysis was performed and it was mutually agreed upon by Hatfield, Lyons and Jet Avia that records requiring detailed examination would be set aside for Xeroxing. Hatfield was to be notified when these records would be turned over to the Government for their examination.

Examination of those records set aside will be performed upon notification by the Department of Justice that the records are available.
