Approximately 3 months ago, I sent a letter to the Governor of Colorado, Bill Owens, Senators Wayne Allard and Ben Nighthorse-Campbell and United States Representative Joel Heffley. Today I write again, adding our very respected Vice President, Dick Cheney, who is working diligently with a "National Energy Task Force". My previous message addressed the concern that I have with escalating prices for electrical power and with the general condition that regardless of who wants to blame, we must take emergency and/or crisis level action to see that the present issues with energy shortfall and rising prices are addressed with long term corrective action and not "band-aids".

I write this letter as both a concerned American and as an Executive in the Semiconductor business with responsibility for a major manufacturing site of Atmel Corp. in Colorado Springs, CO. I believe this problem is as significant as was our need to put men in space -40 years ago, and to say that we had better treat it in the same manner; with a vision given to the American people as to the real nature and size of the problem. Along with the vision of the problem must come a vision for solutions in the near, intermediate, and long term that allows our economic well-being to remain positive and full of hope in each of those forward looking time periods. This is not a smaller task than putting man in space and on the moon, and in reality it is even more important as it has "everything" to do with the American way of life, and the expectations of opportunity that we would wish all to have.

The issue is ENERGY! And as I stated above, at stake is the standard of living of every American, and those citizens of any other country who aspire for economic freedom and opportunity.

All economic issues, events, or situations are the result of the balance of a myriad of forces, to name some:

- Conservation and/or conservationists
- Productivity (Producing the most for the least, or preventing the loss of purchasing power by continuously producing at a higher rate than the underlying cost components)
- Exploration and Development (oil, natural gas, nuclear energy)
- Producing and Refining
- Automobiles being manufactured including a range from "lean machine" to "gas guzzler"

If not for a sustained period of low inflation and high productivity in place at this time, the present economic downturn could very easily have been a major recession. We are lucky and "everyone" had best admit it to themselves. In fact, I contend that this current downturn has the potential for greater retrenching if we don't build confidence that we have a plan in both areas of energy and taxes. Yes, tax relief is important, but the optimum solution to our energy situation and its'

potential influence on our economy is much, much more. We had better have the right answer this time, because this issue has only received "lip service" for the past 30 years, and we had better "sell" our "right answer" to the American public as though it is the emergency that it really is.

We have time to be in control of the play-out of all these opposing forces, but there will be "no more time", if we play "games" with the energy situation again.

Let's recognize with the wisdom of many of the prophets of biblical times, that from blessings can come self-confidence that can erode to arrogance, indulgence, greed, and apathy. We are not "above" the nature of humankind.

We in America have come to a point of economic prosperity and superiority that we believe we can "have our cake, and eat it too", that the "good times" will never run out, that at least is what we have come to expect. As a result, we want to believe that we can leverage all the "easy" forces in the equation, and ignore the harder or more distasteful ones.

Some for instances:

- If one SUV is big, then the next supplier makes a bigger one, and what does the consumer do...he follows in like step.
- If one conservationist wants their State to keep out all new power installations because of "their" more precious environment, then let's do it, ..."but" we don't want to pay higher prices, or do without the many things electrical power provides.
- Maybe the most classic is...."I want to eat any and all the food I want, but I don't want to gain a single pound".

What's the point? The point is that we don't have the time, nor can we get this done if we only do the "easy stuff". We must be willing to conserve in our homes, we must be willing to give up on these "tanker size" SUV's, we must be willing to give some ground, not in the fashion of compromise, but in order to "optimize" and achieve the end which allows the most economic viability: otherwise we will give it up in our standard of living. How do I know? We are already there. Californian's are suffering brownouts, with both gasoline and utility bills they can ill afford. Many lower income citizens, are giving up medicine, or even foods they might otherwise buy, because of "bills" that are now 30-100% higher than a year or two years ago. The bad news is "at the doorstep".

I'm sure that the talent, skill, and demonstrated qualifications of those on Vice President Cheney's Energy Task Force are very adequate to the task. But I do have some concerns, the primary one being that "it's hands off" to have the American citizen forego their existing lifestyle, or in any way require of them more discipline, or live with less options than they do today.

Folks, this is serious: we had best not leave one element aside that can be a contributing factor in this race. Also, is there anyone reading this that agrees with my position that this "IS" bigger than a "man in space", and is just as daunting in the magnitude of issues that we face whether technically, socially, or otherwise? We need to make this a "National Endeavor" and sell the vision of both the problem and the solution, and get our nation behind the program.

Some "must do's":

- Allow and encourage coal-fired power generating installations, by moderating/optimizing the amount of cost of capital equipment with less strict EPA regulations for the next 3-5 years.
- Have each State project both their planned use and capacity of electrical power from both public and private sources. Where critical gaps exist in some States, insure that there are

solutions that can be implemented to close those gaps; as a minimum, understand "where" the problems are and what is being done to remove them.

- Almost every area of the country has seen natural gas prices "double" over the past year. With a combined task force of government and energy company officials, require a composite look at the demand and capacity projected forward; what is required to bring forces into place, from all aspects....exploration, development, transport, delivery; that will mitigate this current rise, or as a minimum insure the present accelerated price trend is moderated. Insure, everything is "on the table", there should be no predatory pricing, or gouging, because of the present demand/supply scenario. If so, it's no different than the abhorrent looting that goes on in the aftermath of a tornado, or hurricane.
- Do the same thing for electrical power installations and generation, what's the plan, where are the gaps, how do we "head them off"?
- Do the same for oil, we face a much higher probability that oil supply shortfall compromises our economy and/or standard of living, than any potential military action.

So far, I've limited this discussion to the existing fossil fuel constraint; when it (fossil fuel) is gone ("fini"), the above arguments get really serious. The thoughts presented above only deal with the short and intermediate term, so why does anyone think that 30-50 years from now (when my grandkids are in their prime) isn't as demanding upon science and technology as was/is the effort by NASA and any associated enterprises in the era of space exploration? Sometimes I get the feeling that we have seen so many technological miracles that we find the one of delivering energy to our homes for heating and cooling in very different ways, or the one of providing fuel to an automobile, that is no longer oil based as a very boring and unimportant endeavor. Quite the opposite, this is as important as any key event in the history of our country, because left undone, it takes away our ability to continue the "productivity" curve such that "every American" has the opportunity before them.

Now, let me address another side of the coin. The last area our politicians want to take action in is the market place, i.e. influence or control prices. Let me touch on three areas where something can be done (if the courage is there to do it):

- 1) As individuals, families, or business enterprises, we are facing ludicrous increases in electrical rates in the year 2000/2001. Please refer to the attached chart, which depicts the price for the Colorado Springs Utilities to purchase power from other sources when used to supplement the existing power capacity available from this very efficient and well run public utilities provider. I think it goes without saying that from 1985 through 1999 those providers of supplemental power were operating on what they considered an acceptable profitability. So what happened? First of all natural gas prices increased, therefore that cost must be passed on. Secondly, nothing else happened except the power providers in the American west saw an opportunity with the California situation to "gouge" the consumer and industrial users of electricity. In fact, the Atmel site here in Colorado Springs will pay an additional ~\$1m for power in 2001 than even that in 2000. How many jobs does \$1m account for? At least 25-30 jobs. Why is it so unreasonable to give a Presidential order that no company in an unstable market environment can have greater than a 100% margin against their cost? The result of such an order would reduce the 2001 rate on the attached chart to less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  of that depicted, and for our new President, such an order would likely increase votes on his behalf in 2004 in California by a significant amount. That should not be President Bush's motivation, but regardless, it's a very likely result.

- 2) Now for gasoline, the present prices are ludicrous and predatory. A year ago oil prices went to \$37 per barrel, and gasoline prices went up dramatically; supposedly because of this huge price increase in basic supply, the many blends and regulations placed on refined gasoline, and the shortage of capacity to actually produce at the rates demanded. One year later, when the oil supply cost is at \$27-28 per barrel, and all other things are basically equal, the price for gasoline is far beyond it's peaks of last year, even though we are only early in the expanded driving season. In a period where consolidation of major "oil" corporations is rampant, due diligence requires the excessive profit rates of these corporations to be reviewed. Why is it that most of our high tech corporations are suffering serious revenue, profit, and stock value setbacks in a time that the major oil firms are more profitable than ever? Please don't try to convince me that we are seeing a huge increase in the "productivity" of our oil firms...they don't even understand the word.
- 3) On the other side, the American people still "wants it's cake and eat it too". I've attached two website renditions of the ever increasing SUV size. We are facing a terribly bleak picture in the near term for gasoline prices and for any real solutions to mitigate this issue to be found. Give an EPA mandate that "all" personal or family vehicles delivered in the year 2003 or 4, achieve 25 mpg on highway, and you will see things change. Will this really "cost" the American public anything? Not really. I myself actually own a 1997 Jeep Grand Cherokee, purchased well before I could read enough material to understand the current scenario being played out. Really, my concern is not with \$1.79-2.00 gas prices, my concern is that unless we do something our economy and our standard of living will be more like many countries around the world than the one that exceeds all expectations ever conceived. By the way, my Grand Cherokee is up for sale!

We are a proud nation, the "land of opportunity", where at some point "all" people will be limited only by their own desire, and personal drive. We face a real crisis and yes, we can't afford to "scare the public", but tell us, the American people, the truth, a complete picture. Show us what really happens if we don't act. Show us what can be done if we do, Show us the options and why you choose to do what you propose to do, we can come together when we "have to", when we must...as a Nation we always have.

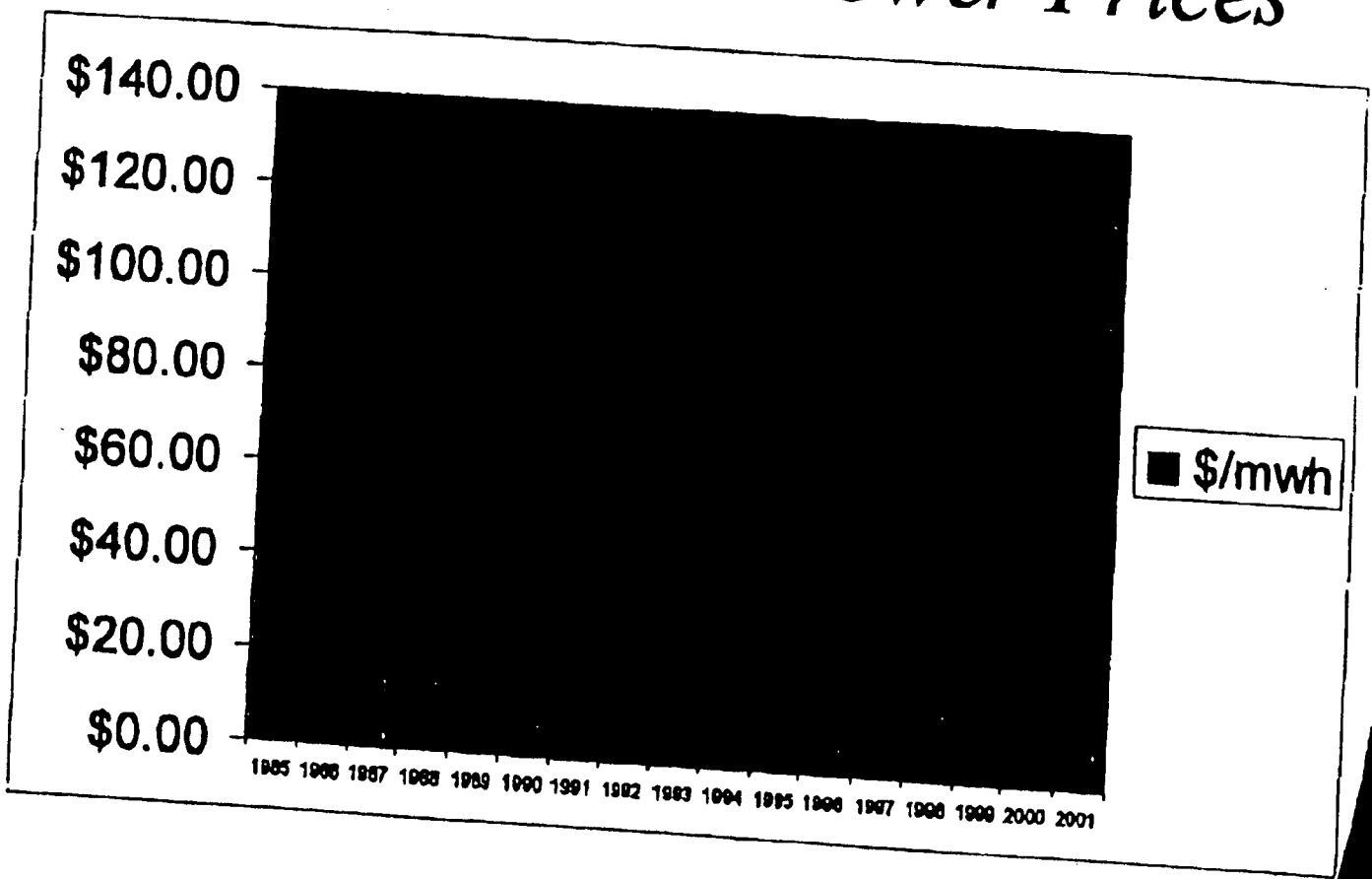

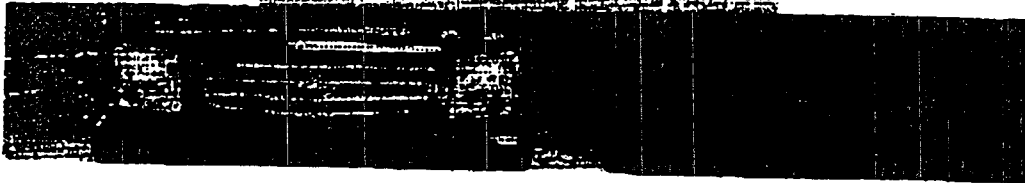

Dear Vice President Cheney:

As a university student, and future leader, I am writing to urge you to make renewable energy and energy efficiency a top priority as you craft a national energy policy. As the head of the President's energy task force you should recommend:

- Diversifying the power supply with additional renewable energy sources by enacting a national market-based Renewables Portfolio Standard (RPS). Diversifying our electricity mix by gradually increasing the percentage of electricity supplied from renewable resources-such as wind, solar, geothermal and biomass-will help avert natural gas price spikes that hit consumer's pocketbooks. Renewable power is not subject to the price volatility that plagues fossil fuel-fired power plants.
- Increasing funding for energy conservation through a national Public Benefits Fund (PBF). Investing in energy efficiency is by far the fastest, least expensive way to balance energy demand and supply needs. This fund will preserve programs to increase energy efficiency; provide low-income customer assistance and universal access; and increase investment in renewable technology research and development
- Increasing funding for the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) renewable energy and energy efficiency programs in the Fiscal Year 2002 (FY'02). The President previously stated that he supports renewables and efficiency. Now there are reports that the administration may cut DOE's energy efficiency and renewable energy research and development budget. These cost-effective programs are vital to the growth and commercialization of renewable energy technologies-solar, wind, geothermal, and biomass.

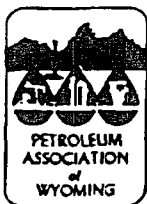
Short-sighted ideas, like drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge, will have virtually no impact on the nation's electricity power prices or supplies as only 2 to 3 percent of US electricity is generated from oil. Renewable energy and energy efficiency are the cheapest, safest and cleanest ways to cope with high electricity prices and reliability problems. Please put America on track to a clean and sustainable energy future by including the above policies in the Task Force's recommendations to the President and Congress.

The Petroleum Association of Wyoming (PAW) would like to thank the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) for the opportunity to comment on issues affecting mineral access to federal lands. PAW is Wyoming's largest and oldest oil and gas organization, the members of which account for over ninety percent of the natural gas and over seventy percent of the crude oil produced in the State. This CEQ Task Force will focus on issues that directly affect members of PAW.

In your request for information, PAW would like to submit the following example, which should be placed in the "Exploration and Production" category:

- **Surface disturbing mitigation decisions determined by BLM that could have an affect on the gas transportation market:**

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has the responsibility of managing certain public lands in the West. Their management decisions include mitigation restrictions that revolve around the placement of oil and gas wells, roads, gathering lines, transportation pipelines, corridors, etc. The BLM Pinedale Field Office in Wyoming has recently made a decision that is concerning to PAW.

A producer, Double Eagle Petroleum Company, participated as a non-operator in the drilling of five wells in the Pinedale Anticline area during the summer and fall of 2001. The company then filed a right-of-way (ROW) application with BLM on October 9, 2001 (see Attachment A) for a four (4) inch temporary surface natural gas pipeline to transport its share of the produced gas to market. There are two existing sales pipelines in the area of the five wells. Both pipelines are owned by Pipeline A, an affiliate of the operator that drilled the wells. Due to economic concerns, the non-operating partner chose to apply for a two-and-one-half (2½) mile temporary surface pipeline to connect with another pipeline owned by a third party pipeline company (Pipeline B) and this temporary line was

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proposed to be placed twenty-five (25) feet from the existing pipeline which is within an existing pipeline corridor (see Attachment C).

To provide CEQ with additional information, most gas in the Pinedale Anticline area or southwest Wyoming goes into three (3) main plants for processing (removing of liquids to meet sales pipeline standards). These plants include: The Opal Plant, the Granger Plant, and Black Fork's Plant all owned by different companies. All three plants are located near the town of Opal (40-60 miles south of the Pinedale Anticline Field). After the gas is processed at the plants, it generally flows west out of Wyoming. Frequently the company gathering the gas at the wellhead does not own the entire line from the well to the plant; however, the pipeline company has agreed with other pipeline companies to transport gas to the specified plant.

According to Double Eagle, currently the preferred market to deliver this gas to is the Opal Plant since there are five (5) pipelines at its tailgate (owned by five separate companies) and that Plant offers the most competition and accordingly offers the best prices to the producer. The offer initially proposed to Double Eagle by Pipeline A was to take all of the gas to its Black's Fork Plant. The problem with this proposal is that Pipeline A owns the Plant and the only pipeline out of the Plant. Based on October's index prices, Pipeline A's price was \$.29/mcf below two other pipeline companies in the area.

The offer proposed by Pipeline B was to deliver gas to the Opal Plant for less gathering cost than Pipeline A. This would allow the operator less gathering cost and allow the delivery of gas to a preferable market. The only problem was that Pipeline B's interconnect was 2½ miles south of the five wells, hence the 2½ mile R-O-W request. Because of BLM's decision to reject the R-O-W application, the producer must use Pipeline A and pay more in gathering costs. This decision will in turn cause the producer to receive less money for the produced gas, pay more in transportation costs, and reduce the money paid to the royalty owners which in this case is the federal government.

BLM rejected the R-O-W application by stating that "[s]ince there is already sufficient capacity in existing pipelines to transport your natural gas, it has been determined that allowing this additional pipeline at this time would not be in the public interest and would cause undue and unnecessary degradation to the public lands" (see Attachment B)

It is not PAW's position to defend a particular company or project over another; however, PAW brings this example to CEQ's attention because there is a concern that BLM's land management decision to refuse granting the second pipeline connection based on surface disturbance will affect the market and potentially set a precedent for future projects on public lands. PAW believes that

it is not within BLM's authority to make land management decisions that significantly affect the gas transportation market (i.e. pricing, available pipeline capacity, transportation, etc.).

Clear and concise written instructions should be issued to BLM state and field offices immediately to guide land management, surface disturbing decisions, which may potentially affect the gas transportation market. Once instructions are issued, careful oversight must be provided by the Administration to ensure that such instructions are interpreted and implemented as were intended.

PAW appreciates this opportunity to provide meaningful comment to the CEQ Energy Task Force regarding issues that affect our ability to access public lands for purposes of natural resource development and industry will continue to strive for a balance between economic growth and environmental protection. Should you have questions or require additional information, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Wall Street's views on the energy crisis

From my daily conversations with institutional investors around the country, I believe the investment community is ready-in principle-to enthusiastically embrace a sound national energy strategy. There is only one important proviso, which is that investors and the investing public have to see a clear connection between the "top-line" policy proposals and the "bottom-line" issues of economic growth and value creation.

Having worked with Wall Street investors for two years now, I have come to realize that investors see the fundamental problem of an energy crisis in ways that are fundamentally different from those of an energy industry CEO or those of a strictly Washington-based policy analyst, such as I used to be.

Wall Street filters everything through market cap and growth potential. They want to know where the value is, and where new value is being created. That is part of the business of allocating capital to the most efficient uses. Wall Street investors are not interested in the fate of a particular industry per se - even an industry that seems big to Washington, such as "coal," "oil," or "nuclear."

Rather, what they will find most attractive about the national energy strategy is 1) moving the whole domestic economy to a higher state of efficiency and 2) creating a new generation of energy companies that will meet the nation's needs in hitherto unrealized ways.

An efficient economy is good for stock valuations across the board. Ending restrictions that inhibit today's energy companies from combining, operating, and deploying new concepts in ways that meet market demand could unleash an enormous new round of value creation.

The Wall Street mindset implies a set of do's and don'ts in presenting the National Energy Strategy to institutional investors. I will start with the don'ts, before getting to the more obvious do, which is the absolute mandate of explaining how a coherent set of policies, maintained over an extended

period of time, will in fact open the door to significant - if not enormous - new investment opportunities.

1. First, don't forget that Wall Street cares about large publicly traded companies. This may seem obvious, but Washingtonians may not realize its full import. Wall street defines large in terms of market cap. Coal companies may be large employers, large in significance to regional economies, and large in their importance as fuel suppliers to electric utilities, but they are not large in terms of market cap. Likewise, independent oil producers may be important as a group, but most IPAA companies have near-zero presence on Wall Street. The integrated oil companies do have a large presence on Wall Street, but it is much diminished from their days of glory, plus the sense from investors is that they are so large, and so exposed to global markets, that domestic U.S. policies won't have a major impact on them. The U.S. refining industry is enjoying an Indian summer of sorts, with a brief period of high margins and favorable prices in what is normally a low-margin business with little potential, due to regulatory constraints, to attract and reward new investments in the longer term.

2. Second, investors dislike anything that looks like direct intervention in the marketplace with a potential to distort market outcomes. Tax incentives and subsidies for uneconomic activities are especially unpopular. There is a sense that with natural gas prices, in particular, at the current levels, companies should have all the incentives to produce they need. Investors worry that too much reliance on tax preferences will lead to a classic boom and bust cycle in the subsidized industries, in which overbuilding ultimately leads to a collapse in valuation.

3. Taking points one and two together, you have a very serious problem in perceptions of what the National Energy Strategy is all about. In the press, investors read only about oil and the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. When investors look at the legislation in Congress, they see (by their lights) mostly a hodge-podge of special interest legislation from the oil-patch states operating in cooperation with the coal states. In other words, investors see what appears to them as a confusing mass of junk that isn't directly relevant to the energy problem as they define it, which is creating 1) a fully integrated, deregulated, diversified national market for energy; 2) the infrastructure necessary to support such a market; and 3) growth opportunities for firms that produce and distribute energy, which is implied in the possibility these firms can offer new services and site new facilities.

4. Investors would welcome opening ANWR to drilling in an environmentally

responsible way. However, they are much more concerned with drilling for natural gas in the continental U.S. There is a sense of confusion about how much land is off-limits for drilling and why, which you could profitably address. However, there is a definite sense that reserves are not growing, and that new wells being drilled are not as productive as the older wells were in the prime, largely because the new wells are not in the most promising areas. Making some kind of coherent statement about federal lands irrespective of ANWR would serve you well.

5. Another theme that resonates with investors is the need to reverse thirty years' chronic under-investment in facilities and infrastructure of all kinds. Investors want to know what you are going to do about the pipelines and electric transmission lines needed to support the national marketplace they look forward to. No one I have ever talked to has the slightest sympathy for the fecklessness of the state of California; they can't believe Davis won't do the obviously right thing (as far as they are concerned) and let retail electricity prices float. You have an opportunity to make a powerful case that some kind of long term, market oriented plan is needed to allow private investment flows to build the new facilities.

6. Now you can see we are getting to some of the do's. A key variable in the equation for stock valuations is the potential for future growth. The way the equation works, even a little increased growth can mean sharply higher price-multiples. But the energy industry has had to deal with physical constraints on growth (no new drilling, siting allowed, etc.) and financial constraints on growth due to regulatory costs. Though companies have consistently increased their efficiency over time, and grown earnings (despite limited upside in revenues) by cutting costs and increasing productivity, these incremental cash flows have been eaten up by higher regulatory costs. As a result, the "g" factor in the P/E equation has been near zero. The investment community will therefore take note if you can make a credible case that 1) you will permit the industry to build out and expand capacity subject to undistorted market forces over an extended period of time and 2) you will do something about regulatory cost creep, so that companies which can meet or exceed environmental standards while cutting costs and improving productivity can actually return that increased "delta" to their shareholders. Our analysts believe that such a policy shift would allow a rise in energy industry P/E's across the board.

In summary, claiming that P/E's should go up or attempting to jawbone their increase is something the White House should absolutely not do on its own. But if you provide reasonable, credible, and reliable basis that your policies will allow capacity growth, earnings growth, and efficient new combinations, Wall Street analysts can connect the dots and perform the requisite calculations on their own.

So cut through the clutter. Don't make us think the entire energy policy is about ANWR, stripper wells in Texas, and employment in Appalachia. These are all important concerns, but things which investors consider to be second tier elements of a package that should properly focus on capacity and distribution, natural gas and electricity, and ending unjustified constraints on growth.

PS-It wouldn't hurt to tell us more about what a "hemispheric" energy policy means, because if an integrated national marketplace is a good thing, an integrated hemisphere would seem to be even better.

PPS-We would like to hear about the "comprehensiveness" of your energy policy in terms that recall the way businesses have undergone comprehensive restructurings and reorganizations in the context of a six-sigma or total quality management plan.



On behalf of the Alliance member companies, I would like to invite you to address our member company executives at a time that fits in your schedule. We know you fully understand the substantial contribution the automobile industry makes to the economic growth of the U.S. Our Board members would welcome the opportunity to discuss the critical role the auto industry can play in the development of a national energy policy.



# ENERGY POLICY POSITION

The Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers (Alliance) members are BMW of North America, Inc., DaimlerChrysler Corporation, Fiat, Ford Motor Company, General Motors Corporation, Isuzu Motors of America, Mazda, Mitsubishi, Nissan North America, Porsche, Toyota, Volkswagen of America, and Volvo. Alliance member companies have more than 620,000 employees in the United States, with more than 250 manufacturing facilities in 35 states.

### Overview

The Alliance supports efforts to create an effective energy policy based on broad, market oriented principles. Policies that provide manufacturers incentives to produce more energy efficient products, and consumers the incentives to purchase such products, should be the cornerstones. Within the transportation sector, policies that promote and support the intense competition among the automobile manufacturers worldwide are the keys to addressing product efficiency and energy use concerns. This approach will enable automakers to work effectively within the private sector, and with public sector support, develop the advanced technologies for use in vehicles both near and long-term. In addition, incentives for the increased market penetration of advanced energy saving technologies will help pull them into the marketplace as rapidly as possible. These complementary approaches to energy supply and conservation are necessary in today's competitive environment.

For the past 26 years, since enactment of the Energy Policy Conservation Act of 1975, vehicle fuel economy has been regulated through the Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFE) program. For several reasons, CAFE is an ineffective energy policy. First, it focuses only on new vehicle production and does nothing to spur the demand for fuel-efficient vehicles. With falling gasoline prices and adequate supplies instead of projected shortages, demand for fuel-efficient vehicles never materialized. Second, CAFE does not address the continued use of the approximately 200 million vehicles on the road. The growth in registered vehicles, together with the relatively inexpensive cost of fuel and increased vehicle fuel efficiency, has led to a doubling of vehicle miles traveled. Third, consumers have based purchase decisions on other vehicle attributes, such as usefulness, safety, performance and comfort. Fourth, like any artificial structure, it has disproportionate effects on some vehicle manufacturers. With this background, we propose the following:

### Provide Tax Credits to Consumers for Advanced Technology Vehicles

- Fuel Cell Vehicle
- Hybrid Vehicle
- Battery Electric Vehicles
- Advanced Lean Burn
- Dual Fuel and Dedicated Alternative Fuel Vehicles

### Provide Tax Incentives for Alternative Fuel Infrastructure Development

- Distribution Equipment
- Installation Costs
- Distributor Credit for Fuel Distribution

### The Administration should extend the Dual-Fuel Vehicle CAFE Credits

- Release the DOT report originally required September 30, 2000.
- Initiate rulemaking that would extend credit through 2008 at the maximum levels provided in the current legislation.
- Congress should enact legislation to extend the credits at 1.2 mpg through 2012.

### Advanced Fuel/Vehicle Market Development

- Government purchase XXXX advanced technology vehicles per year.
- Promote early introduction of clean, low sulfur gasoline and diesel fuels.

### Encourage Government/Industry Partnerships for Research and Development on Fuel Efficient Technologies

- Promote research and development for lean burn emissions control technologies.
- Accelerate development of advanced engine and emission control systems to enable earlier technology deployment (e.g. NOx traps)

I am disturbed by early reports that the Energy Task Force recommendations fail to recognize the need to include a path forward for assuring that this country is capable of providing a reliable and economic source of nuclear fuel for commercial nuclear reactors. As you know, nuclear power is the second largest supplier of electricity generation in the country. Unfortunately, it is not unreasonable to expect that the U.S. could have an OPEC-like dependency on foreign sources of nuclear fuel supplies in the near future. To prevent such a situation, the U.S. needs to deploy cost competitive uranium enrichment technology or we will rely on foreign supplies to meet nearly one quarter of our electricity needs.

There have been adverse consequences to the nation's energy security as a result of the privatization of the United States Enrichment Corporation (USEC) in July 1998. USEC is the only domestic supplier of uranium enrichment services in the U.S. When it was privatized, USEC operated two gaseous diffusion plants located in Piketon, Ohio and Paducah, Kentucky. However, last June, USEC made the decision to cease operations at the Piketon Gaseous Diffusion Plant (GDP) ignoring the advice of the Departments of Energy and Treasury. The targeted date for turning the key to the "off position" is June 1, 2001.

A Department of Energy report issued on January 19, 2001 describes the need for the U.S. "to be able to reliably meet the continuing demand for approximately 11 million separative work units (SWU) per year." However, the Paducah plant can only produce approximately 4.5 million SWU per year in an economic manner. The balance of requirements comes from 5.5 million SWU derived from blended down weapons grade uranium imported from Russia under the U.S.-Russia HEU Agreement and some European supplies. It is evident that the operation of a single enrichment plant in the country, coupled with a history of five interruptions in the delivery of enriched uranium under the Highly Enriched Uranium Purchase Agreement with Russia, raises questions about the vulnerability of the U.S. to a disruption in the supply of enriched uranium.

This supply mix may change even further to the detriment of energy security. First, an August 2000 Nuclear Regulatory Commission report on USEC's viability suggests that USEC is unlikely to enrich uranium profitably at the Paducah plant beyond 2003. Second, USEC is trying to expand U.S. dependency on Russian nuclear fuel supplies beyond the 5.5 million separative work units (SWU) that it imports each year as Executive Agent under the U.S.- Russia HEU Agreement. USEC has been proposing additional imports of commercial enriched uranium through Tenex, the Russian export agent. One interim solution to maintain insurance against nuclear fuel supply disruptions from Russia is through a cold standby operation for the Piketon, Ohio enrichment plant. I am pleased that Secretary Abraham has taken the steps to provide for cold standby through fiscal year 2002. However, this standby plan must be linked to deployment of cost-competitive technology, such as gas centrifuge technology, and must be extended until the new technology is fully deployed. I fear there has not been adequate attention given to what happens beyond fall 2002 and this is particularly troubling because the Department of Energy's testimony before the Energy and Air Quality Subcommittee on March 27, 2001 indicates that after five or six years of cold standby there would be significant degradation to the Piketon plant.

I am aware that the Europeans have competitive centrifuge technology, and I understand that the Oak Ridge National Laboratories have a plan to develop cost-competitive U.S.-origin centrifuge technology within a three year time period. However, at present, there is virtually no effort toward domestic self-sufficiency in enrichment services, no clear path forward for deployment from the private sector, and no government policy in effect to address the matter. Privatization has failed to deploy the advanced laser enrichment technology (AVLIS) that received nearly \$2 billion in federal R&D. Indeed, two years have passed since USEC announced it was terminating the AVLIS Program and nothing has emerged to replace the WW-II era gaseous diffusion plants in the next decade. Indeed, USEC's impaired credit ratings make it unlikely that they could obtain financing to deploy any technology.

Given the short-term nature of the Administration's cold standby plan and the absence of any long-term strategy to utilize the Piketon facility and deploy next generation enrichment technology, the plan for Piketon presently falls well-short of the commitment made by President Bush during the campaign. In an enclosed October 4, 2001 letter to Ohio Governor Bob Taft, then-Governor Bush expressed his concern about USEC's decision to cease operations at the Piketon plant. He stated, "I am concerned that the closure of the Piketon site, which would leave only one uranium enrichment plant operational in the United States, would compromise our long-term national security interest in a continued safe supply of enriched uranium for our defense and energy needs." He further committed in that letter, "If I am elected President, my Administration will aggressively explore how the workforce and facilities at the Piketon site can continue to serve our national interest. I believe that our nation must continue to pursue research and development of new technologies for use in uranium enrichment." Release of the Energy Task Force report is the best opportunity for the Administration to follow through on its commitment to the Piketon community and our nation's nuclear energy security.

The need for a secure, domestic uranium enrichment supply is underscored by the fact that nuclear power is enjoying improved operating economics and increased average efficiency of reactors. Demand is likely to remain stable or grow, as approximately 40% of the domestic nuclear reactors are currently seeking license renewals. During a hearing on nuclear power before the Energy and Air Quality Subcommittee on March 27, 2001, there was discussion about building the next generation nuclear reactors in the not-so-distant future. These next generation reactors will require 8-10% U-235 enrichment, compared with the 4-5% levels required for the current generation of boiling water reactors. It is troubling that USEC is closing the Piketon facility which is the only U.S. enrichment plant that is licensed to enrich uranium to 10% assay, when there is a trend toward higher assay fuel.

During the March 27, 2001 Energy and Air Quality Subcommittee hearing, testimony was offered which stated:

"USEC utilized only about 29% of its nameplate GDP capacity in 2000, and over the next year will supply a majority of its customers needs from Russian and U.S. HEU blending." (Testimony of John R. Longenecker, former USEC official).

Mr. Longenecker further states:

"USEC is finding it more profitable to operate as a trader of blended HEU rather than as a primary producer. This approach appears to lead inevitably to USEC exiting the market as a primary producer. As a result, constructing replacement enrichment capacity in the U.S. should be the key focus for the decade ahead."

In addition, during a June 8, 2000 hearing before the Commerce Subcommittee on Energy and Power, testimony was submitted stating that the front end of the nuclear fuel cycle is endangered:

"Since 1998, expenditures for uranium exploration and mine development have declined by 59%; three uranium processing facilities have closed during 1999 (two in Texas and one in Louisiana); employment in U.S. uranium exploration, mining, milling and process has decreased by almost 30%. Last year, production at ConverDyn, the sole remaining uranium converter in the U.S. was cut back by 25% and employment was reduced by over 12%." (Testimony of Mr. James Graham, President and CEO of ConverDyn).

If this nation's energy policy is going to place a greater emphasis on nuclear power, it must do so in a comprehensive fashion. An energy policy that ignores the reliability of the front end of the domestic nuclear fuel industry falls short of assuring needed energy security in this country. I urge you to carefully consider the needs of the entire nuclear fuel cycle as you prepare

to issue your recommendations for a national energy strategy. I know you will agree that Americans would find it unwise and unacceptable to depend on foreign sources for the second largest supplier of U.S. electricity generation, nuclear power.

I am writing regarding my growing concern over the events surrounding the decision by the United States Enrichment Corporation (USEC) to shut down the Portsmouth Gaseous Diffusion Facility at Piketon. As you know, on September 29, 2000, USEC gave notice to the United States Department of Energy (DOE) to cancel its contract for electric power. As the current congressional appropriations process for fiscal year 2001 comes to a close, I am further concerned that the DOE has yet to articulate a plan for future clean-up and use of the site in Portsmouth, as well as for the more than 2,000 employees at the Portsmouth facility.

I am concerned that the closure of the Piketon site, which would leave only one uranium enrichment plant operational in the United States, would compromise our long-term national security interest in a continued safe supply of enriched uranium for our defense and energy needs. The Clinton-Gore Administration has not articulated a cohesive and aggressive plan for the highly skilled workforce and the highly specialized equipment at the Piketon plant. This demonstrates a lack of leadership relative to a key national security issue that I will not tolerate as President.

If I am elected President, my Administration will aggressively explore how the workforce and facilities at the Piketon site can continue to serve our national interest. I believe that our nation must continue to pursue research and development of new technologies for use in uranium enrichment. Furthermore, I will ensure that the resources that have been committed by Congress for Decontamination and Decommissioning (D&D) of this site will be available in a timely manner. Finally, I will direct the DOE to explore other research opportunities that will continue to utilize the resources at Piketon. Simply stated, if I am elected President, I will work with Congress to help the Piketon workforce remain productive, ensure federal D&D obligations are met, and ensure new opportunities for R&D are explored.

I know you are actively working at the state level to ensure opportunities for the workers at Piketon and their families. I look forward to working with you on this critical Ohio issue in the future.

# Paul: Nuclear needed

## Says he'll use education to provide oversight

President George Bush's administration contends that nuclear power should be included among the solutions to address the nation's "energy crisis" — and Florida should be no exception, according to state Rep. Jerry Paul, R-Port Charlotte.

However, Florida Power and Light officials said in a recent annual report that Florida doesn't face an energy crisis. FPL plans to increase its generating capacity by 33 percent over the next 10 years, "using environmentally friendly natural-gas

technology," according to the report.

Rep. Paul, however, cited the fact that nuclear power has proven to be "the safest and cheapest

source of electrical power, compared to coal, gas and oil-fired plants.

"We've got to make sure Florida does not get trapped in a California scenario," Paul said. "If we don't have the capacity then our electric rates will go up."

"Really, the touchstone in all of this, the primary goal, has got to be to keep the cost of electrical power as low as possible."

Paul, a member of the state's House Committee on Utilities and Telecommunications, was appointed this year by House Speaker Tom Feeney to the Southern States Energy Board. Florida Sen. Tom Lee,

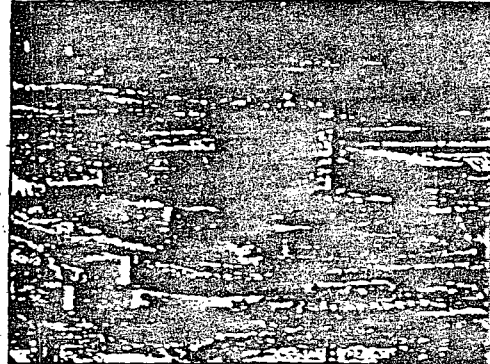

R-Brandon, is the state's other representative on the board.

Paul was reached in Miami Tuesday where he was attending a two-day meeting of the SSE board to discuss the hurdles to nuclear power projects in the Southeastern United States.

Paul said he hopes to use his educational background to oversee the expansion of nuclear power in Florida. The Port Charlotte attorney earned degrees in marine engineering at the Merchant Marine Academy in Maine in 1988, and in nuclear engineering at the University of Florida in 1991.

"We're talking about the states' role in overseeing our nuclear industry," Paul said.

One of the biggest issues for the state is the storage of spent fuel rods, Paul said.

In Florida, these hazardous materials have been indefinitely stored in pools on the sites of FPL's three nuclear power generating stations.

Those stations include: two reactors at Turkey Point near Homestead, two reactors at St. Lucie and one reactor at Crystal River.

Board members from other states also discussed their concerns, including how to dispose of radioactive wastes from nuclear weapons facilities. Paul said Florida currently

has no such facilities.

Paul argues that nuclear materials are naturally found in the ground and could be stored there. One factor that has held the industry back has been the federal government's reluctance to establish a national nuclear waste storage facility, Paul said.

Former President Jimmy Carter closed two facilities that reprocessed spent fuel rods so they could be fissioned a second time, Paul said.

"He forced every state to basically store its own waste," Paul said. "That cost us all a lot."

Some 20 years ago, Congress vowed to establish a nuclear storage facility by the year 2000 at Yucca Mountain, Utah. However, that facility is currently 10 years behind schedule, according to Paul.

Paul said Florida currently produces about 40,000 megawatts of power, with 20 percent derived from nuclear power.

The state has a "deficit of about 13,000 megawatts" due to growth projections and increased use of computer technology, he said.

To avoid a crisis like California's, Florida needs to diversify its power sources, Paul said. California not only depended heavily on natural gas, but it also was blocked by "extremist groups" from building new power plants for the past 10 years, Paul said.

However, Paul emphasized

that Florida needs to first promote energy conservation and alternative sources such as wind, solar and "biomass" fuels.

After nuclear power, the next cheapest is coal. But coal pollutes the air with sulfur dioxide, Paul noted. Natural gas is cleaner, but Florida would require pipelines to get the gas, he added.

"There is no free lunch," he said. "It is costing us a lot. And there is an environmental toll."

However, FPL, in an annual report filed with the Public Service Commission in April, projected a 20-percent generating reserve margin for this summer, assuring its customers that there would be a sufficient supply of electricity.

Also, FPL's report outlines its 10-year plan to increase capacity by 33 percent using natural gas.

A pipeline has also been recently permitted to run from Texas through the Gulf of Mexico to Port Manatee. The pipeline will then cross the state to Fort Pierce with a spur to the south.

"Unlike California, Florida customers enjoy an adequate supply of electricity," said FPL President Paul Evanson. "Our expansion program reflects our commitment to maintain sufficient reserves while remaining one of the cleanest utilities in the country."





Two Arctic Refuge drilling bills (H.R.4 : the House-passed energy bill and a separate Arctic Refuge bill) have already been filed as possible amendments to the bill . Oppose any attempts to attach any of these amendments.

Dear Secretary of Interior Noron, Mr. President, US Government officials, Senators,

I'm writing to urge you, to please :

1: PLEASE OPPOSE ANY KIND OF ARCTIC REFUGE DRILLING
AMENDMENT OR RIDER TO THE ECONOMIC STIMULUS BILL
OR MILITARY FUNDING BILL OR ANY OTHER BILL !

2: Secretary of Interior Noron mischaracterized Arctic Refuge Data. Data Don't Support Norton's Statements on Environmental Effects of Drilling. The Secretary's official reply to Senator Murkowski on July 11,2001 was markedly different from the scientific input she had received. (see References # 1 )

3: STOP UN-"LIMITED" ACCESS TO ARCTIC REFUGEE :
The energy bill supposedly limits the area available for drilling to 2,000 acres - implying a small concentrated spot on the coastal plain. However, according to the U.S. Geological Survey, oil under the Arctic Refuge coastal plain would not be concentrated in one large reserve but rather would be spread out in numerous small deposits -requiring multiple interconnected oil fields stretching across the coastal plain. In addition, the "2,000 acres" only refers to places where the infrastructure makes actual physical contact with the tundra (i.e. instead of including the entire length of a pipeline, it would only include the upright supports). Plus the "2,000 acres" does not include gravel mines or gravel roads - both of which would disturb considerable areas of tundra and add to the spider web of infrastructure across the coastal plain.

4: PLEASE STOP FOSSIL FUEL DEPENDENT:
America cannot drill its way to energy independence. The U.S. has at most 2-3% of the world's oil reserves while accounting for 25% of the world's oil consumption. It is simply not possible to produce our way to oil independence, even if we sacrifice all of our wilderness, parks, refuges, and coastlines. The only way to reduce dependence on foreign oil is through Conservation and Alternative energy supplies. The Vice President Cheney has been sued over his "secret" Energy Task Force by the Judicial Watch. (See References # 2 )

5: IT IS ONLY A DROP IN THE BUCKET:
The U.S. Geological Survey estimates that at no time would the oil recovered from the Arctic Refuge amount to more than about

2 percent( 2%) of US demand. We would still need to import over half of our oil from foreign countries.

**6: OUTDATED NATIONAL ENERGY POLICY:**

There is no way, America can drill the way to lower prices or energy independence. The natural resources supply is always finite. Years ago, America depended on the oil from the whales and killing whales ruthlessly until all of the whale species approached total extinction. The same logic applies to the Fossil fuel.

Therefore, the US energy policy must emphasize decreasing the Demand rather than increasing the Supply of fossil fuels.

There are reliable and sensible means of achieving these ends - such as energy Conservation, Alternative energies and Improved energy efficiency - which can reduce our dependence on oil without sacrificing environmental protection.

**7: UNSUSTAINABLE JOBS:** the number of jobs that would be generated by drilling in the Arctic Refuge coastal plain is misleading and flawed. The numbers commonly touted by those in favor of drilling (750,000 jobs) come from a flawed 1990 study commissioned by the American Petroleum Institute (API). A 1994 study by the Economic Policy Institute concluded that the total number of jobs generated by drilling in the refuge would be fewer than 8 percent than what the API exaggerated estimates. Also the job opportunity would last only five years(5 years).

However, a 1993 study, conducted by the Tellus Institute for The Wilderness Society, concluded that initiatives to improve vehicle fuel efficiency and non-transport energy efficiency would result in nearly Ten times as many jobs as drilling in the Arctic Refuge. (see References # 5 )

**8: SPILL, ENVIRONMENTALLY DEVASTATING :**

Oil development cannot be done in an "environmentally sensitive" manner. Since 1996, the Prudhoe Bay oil fields and Trans-Alaska Pipeline have caused an average of approximately 400 spills annually on the North Slope - most commonly spills of diesel and crude oil. Whether an accident or faulty maintenance, the Arctic Refuge coastal plain is too precious to risk from spills such as these. The Arctic Refuge is the only U.S. refuge encompassing a complete spectrum of arctic and subarctic ecosystems. This combination of habitats helps support the Refuge's nature's most beautiful biodiversity. (please see References # 3, # 4 )

While the nation and the world is shocked by the WTC tragedy, please do NOT use this tragic opportunity to destroy our nation's most unique treasure the Arctic Wildlife Refuge to satisfy the handful people's taste of greed, selfishness and corruption.

We and all of our members, friends, relatives, will NOT vote for any legislator who supports any Drilling in the Arctic Wildlife Refuge bills, amendments, riders or deals.

Please OPPOSE any Drilling in Arctic Wildlife Refuge completely .

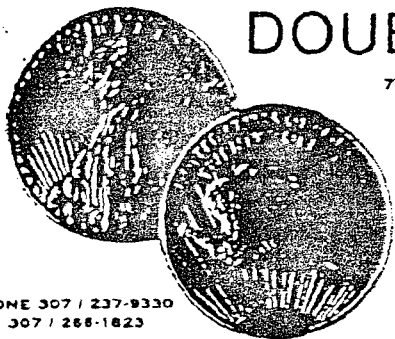

PROJECT: To construct a 4" natural gas pipeline crossing federal lands approximately 1.5 miles in length in order to connect Wexpro's Mesa #11-16 well into existing gas gathering system of Duke Energy, formerly known as Jonah Gas Gathering.

Facility Description:

- 1) Purpose and Need for the Right-of-Way Facility:
  - a) Commodity - natural gas from gas well.
  - b) Pipeline is a temporary gathering line.
  - c) Pipeline will be placed on surface during winter 2001-2002 pending installation of a larger pipeline by Duke Energy expected in the summer of 2002.
  - d) There is no required area of disturbance as pipeline will be placed on surface. The surface will not be bladed. Work on installation will be confined to the existing roadway area paralleling the pipeline. Once the pipeline is prepared, it will be placed on the surface manually.
  - e) Pipeline will occupy space adjacent and parallel to existing pipelines operating under right of way #WYW- 79588 across federal lands.
  - f) The entire route of the proposed right of way across federal lands has been the subject of several cultural surveys performed by Jonah Gas Gathering, Mountain Fuel Supply, Ultra Resources and Mountain Gas Resources.
- 2) Facility Design Factors:
  - a) Pipeline pressure will be 200-1,000 psi, pipe weight and grade to withstand said pressure with estimated flow rates up to 5 MMCFD.
  - b) Gas is "sweet" gas, no measurable toxic gases are present.
  - c) Soil is clay and sandy clay.
  - d) Pipeline operating temperature 60-80 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 3) Additional Components to the Right-of-Way:
  - a) Gathering line from the Mesa #11-16 will connect into existing gathering line owned by Duke Energy, formerly Jonah Gas Gathering in Section 27, Township 32 North, Range 109 West.
  - b) No pumping, compressor or metering facilities will be located on the BLM right of way requested.
- 4) A right of way will be obtained from The Wyoming State Land Office on

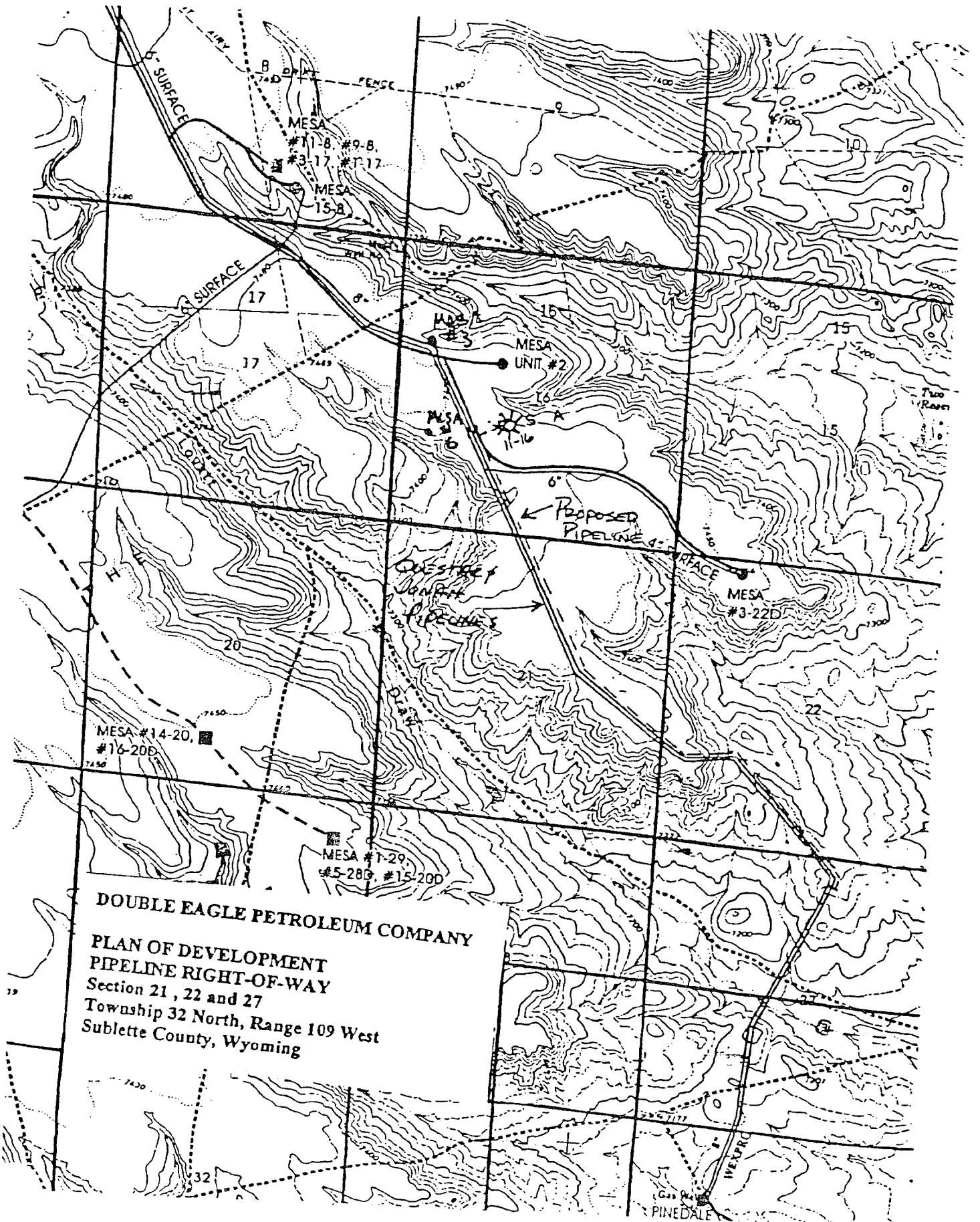
approximately .5 miles of proposed pipeline that cross in Section 16 (T32N-R109W).

- 5) Right-of-Way is located as captioned above and as shown on the attached map, more specifically from the Mesa #11-16 well across State Lands for approximately .5 miles and across BLM lands for approximately 1.5 miles until pipeline connects with said pipeline owned by Duke Energy.
- 6) No other resource values are affected.
- 7) Stabilization and Rehabilitation - recontoured ground will be reseeded, water diversion ditches will be cut on all grades. Pipeline will be left in place upon completion of the project. There will be no unnecessary surface disturbance.
- 8) Operation - no regular vehicle traffic will run on the right-of-way, however, the line will be checked occasionally for leaks. It may be necessary to expose a portion of the line for repairs from time-to-time; if so, the disturbance will be minimized, ground recontoured and reseeded.

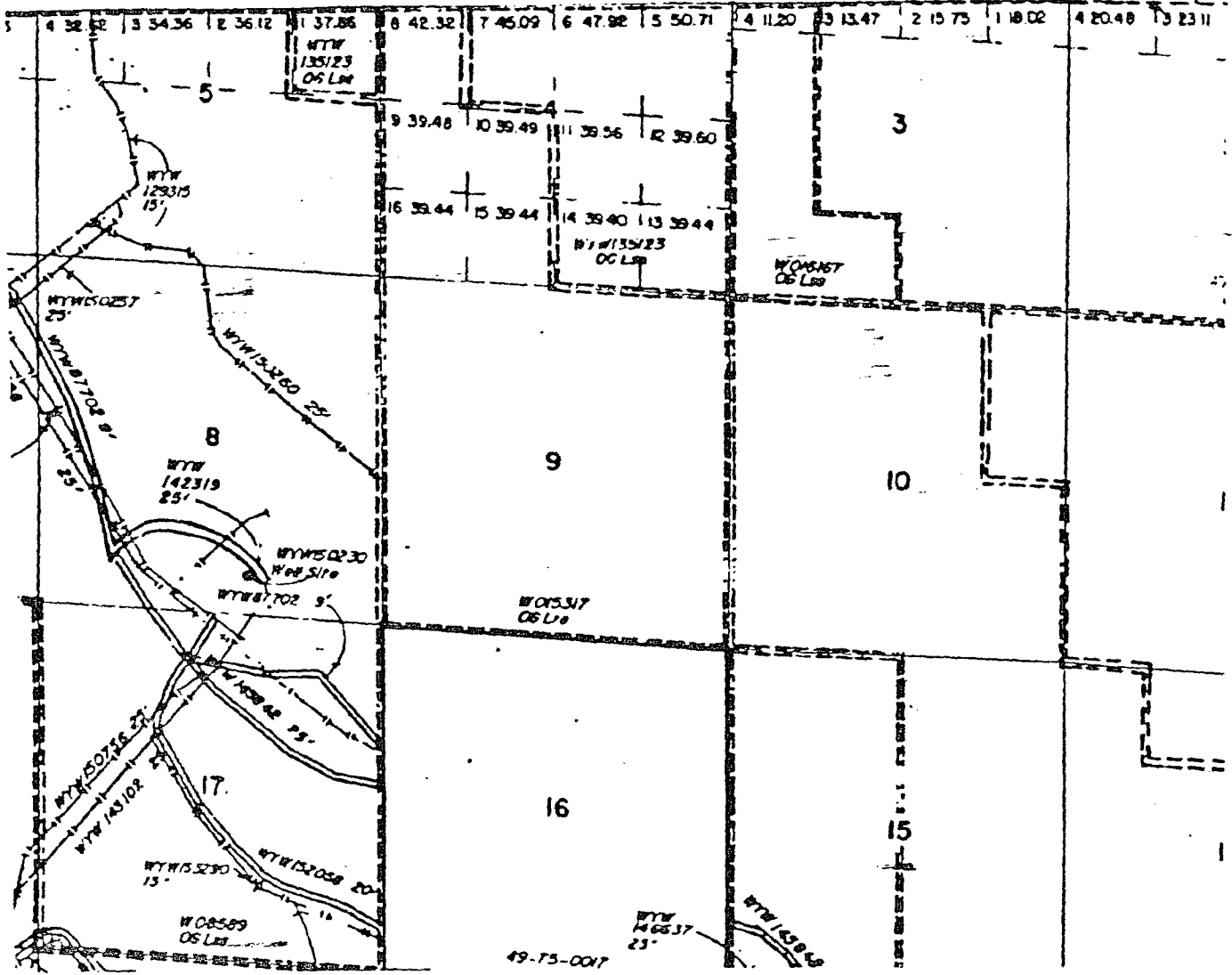
