



- Vote to keep Improve Child Occupant Protection on the Most Wanted list








Belt Use Rates in Primary & Secondary States—2006





 - Open–Unacceptable Response for South Dakota
- Vote to keep Enact Primary Seat Belt
 Enforcement Laws on the Most Wanted List





Promote Youth Highway Safety

- Enact 3-stage graduated licensing laws with a passenger restriction
 H-02-32 (Issued to 14 States without both GDL and a passenger restriction)
- Restrict number of teen passengers
 H-02-30 (Issued to 29 States with GDL, but no passenger restriction)
- Restrict wireless communication device use by novice drivers
 H-03-08 (Issued to 48 States)


Graduated Licensing Laws for Teen Drivers






Passenger Restriction Laws for Teen Drivers

Teen Passenger Restriction Law Progress






States With Interactive Wireless Communication Device (Cell Phone) Use Restrictions for Young Drivers

 - Open–Acceptable Response for Arizona

Reclassify H-02-30 as proposed:

- Closed–Acceptable Action for Ohio
- Open–Acceptable Response for Idaho
- Open—Acceptable Alternate Response for 2 States (AR and LA)
- Open—Unacceptable Response for 2 States (SC and SD)

Promote Youth Highway Safety

Proposed Action on this Issue Area

- Reclassify H-03-8 as proposed:
 - Closed—Acceptable Action for 2 States (CA and NE)
 - Open—Acceptable Response for 2 States (VA, and WA)
 - Open–Acceptable Alternate Action for 5 States (MO, NM, ND, OR, and UT)
 - Open—Unacceptable Response for 3 States (MT, SC, and WY)
- Vote to keep Promote Youth Highway Safety on Most Wanted list





Proposed Action on this Issue Area

- Reclassify H-00-26 as proposed:
 - Open—Acceptable Response for 4 States (FL, HI, IL, and NY)
 - Open—Acceptable Alternate Action for 2 States (MI and WA)
 - Open–Unacceptable Response for 4 States (MA, MO, MT, and ND)
- Vote to keep Eliminate Hard Core Drinking Driving on Most Wanted list




Improve School Bus Grade Crossing Safety

Improve School Bus/Grade Crossing Safety

- Install stop signs at passive crossings
- Upgrade passive crossings with active warning devices
- Install noise-reducing switches on new buses
- Enhance bus driver training and evaluation
- Include grade crossing questions in CDL exams







Boat Operator Knowledge










Pre-Rental Instruction for PWC Operators
