## HAWAI'l'S SEASONALLY ADJUSTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 3.9 PERCENT IN JULY

## National Unemployment Rate rises to 5.7 percent

HONOLULU- The Hawai'i State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations announced today that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for July was 3.9 percent, a slight increase from 3.8 percent in June. In comparison, the U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate went from 5.5 percent in June to 5.7 percent in July. In the past year, Hawai'i's seasonally adjusted labor force has expanded by 17,150, or 2.6 percent, to 664,700. In July, there were 638,600 employed and 26,150 unemployed statewide.

## Industry Payroll Employment

In another measure of employment, total seasonally adjusted nonagricultural jobs declined over-the-month from June by 3,100 to 622,900 . The job gain in the private sector occurred in Construction (+100). Job reduction was most notable in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-800) partially resulting from the release of additional staffing with the departure of a cruise ship. There were also declines in Educational and Health Services and Leisure and Hospitality (-400 each). Government reported a 100 job loss. From July 2007, the seasonally adjusted job count reported a 200 job gain. Over-the-year, the industries in the private sector experiencing job growth were Educational and Health Services $(+1,800)$ and Other Services $(+600)$.
"Hawai'i's job numbers continue to reflect the effects of external economic conditions on our economy," said Colleen Y. LaClair, Deputy Director of Labor and Industrial Relations. "We are encouraged that Hawai'i continues to post unemployment rates significantly lower then the U.S. average."

## * Construction (+100)

Construction edged upward for the second consecutive month even while other sectors reported job losses. The increase occurred in heavy and civil engineering construction mainly in utility system construction and highway, street, and bridge construction.

## * Other Services (No change)

This miscellaneous sector remained relatively stable. The increase in personal care service was setback by labor unions and similar labor organizations as well as auto repair and maintenance.

## * Educational and Health Services (-400)

Educational and Health Services experienced job decline after reporting an increase in June. Education slipped by 200 jobs in private education. Health Care and Social Assistance also registered a 200 job decrease. The losses were in Hospitals due to some private institutions releasing staff; as well as in Social Assistance due to fewer workers reported in physicians' offices.

## * Leisure and Hospitality (-400)

This major industry continued its downturn trend. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation contracted by a modest 100 jobs in promoters of performing arts, sports, and similar events. Accommodation and Food Services accounted for the remaining 300 job reduction. While part of the drop was due to releasing hotel staffing resulting from slow business, the bulk of the job losses were in Food Services in full-services restaurants.

## * Trade, Transportation \& Utilities (-800)

This industrial group experienced the largest over-the-month drop in July. Wholesale Trade remained unchanged for the third consecutive month. The uptrend in merchant wholesalers, durable goods was countered by the downtrend in merchant wholesalers, nondurable goods. Retail Trade reported a drop of 300 jobs, which occurred in various sectors in the industry including clothing and clothing accessories stores; food and beverage stores; and building material and garden equipment and supplies dealers. The remaining job decline was in Transportation and Warehousing primarily resulting from the departure of a cruise ship as it continued its release of additional personnel.

## * Government (-100)

Government decreased by a minimal 100 jobs. Both Federal Government and Local Government each reported a loss of 100 jobs. State Government recorded a gain of 100 jobs mainly in the Department of Education.
