

## Birds of the Detroit Lakes Wetland Management District

In 1958, the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service initiated the Small Wetlands Program to protect critical waterfowl and wildlife habitat. Since that time, some 166 parcels of land totaling more than 43,000 acres in Becker, Clay, Mahnomen, Norman, and Polk Counties in northwestern Minnesota have been preserved in the Detroit Lakes Wetland Management District (WMD). These areas are known as Waterfowl Production Areas and range in size from 9 acres to nearly 2,000 acres.

The Detroit Lakes WMD is located in a transition zone where the tallgrass prairie meets the edges of both northern hardwood and boreal forest ecosystems. The variety of habitats found in this region offer excellent birding opportunities.

The following list of 289 species has been developed from past and existing records and from first-hand knowledge of local and visiting birding enthusiasts. We invite visiting birders to stop in at our WMD office near Detroit Lakes, Minnesota to share their bird sightings and learn more about specific birding locations. Enjoy your visit. Good birding!
