TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:

On May 5, 2008, the Department of Commerce (“Department”) initiated an antidumping duty investigation to determine whether citric acid and certain citrate salts from the People’s Republic of China are being sold in the United States at less than fair value. *See Citric Acid and Certain Citrate Salts from Canada and the People’s Republic of China: Initiation of Antidumping Duty Investigations*, 73 FR 27492 (May 13, 2008).

On May 20, 2008, the Department posted a letter and questionnaire on its website, dated May 23, 2008, requesting information on the quantity and U.S. dollar sales value of all exports to the United States of citric acid and certain citrate salts. *See* <http://ia.ita.doc.gov/ia-highlights-and-news.html> (Canada, China: Citric Acid and Certain Citrate Salts). As part of that posting, the Department noted that it was extending the original May 27, 2008, deadline to June 12, 2008.

A copy of the May 23, 2008, letter and questionnaire is enclosed herein. Due to unforeseen circumstances, the Department was not able to issue the quantity and value questionnaire to the exporters/producers named in the petition concurrently with the website posting. As a result of the delayed mailing, the Department is extending the due date for the response to the quantity and value questionnaire; your response is now due to the Department no later than **5:00 p.m. on June 26, 2008**. This new deadline will be posted on the Department’s website.
