I. APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR FPCA

The Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) is the primary form for requesting registration and/or an absentee ballot from your local election official. **Read all instructions printed below and on the FPCA before completing and signing your application.** Circled letters correspond to the circled letters on the sample form on the preceding page.

- A Block 2.f and 2.g: Your West Virginia Driver's License is required for voter registration. If you do not have a driver's license, the last four digits of your social security number is required. If you do not possess either of these identifications, the State shall assign a number that will serve to identify you for voter registration purposes.
- Block 3.a through 3.e: Provide the complete street address of your West Virginia voting residence. A post office box is not sufficient. If your address includes a rural route, describe its location in Block 6. For example: "2 miles up Low Gap Creek from Highway 11." This address must be different from the one provided in Block 4 and must be within the county or township where you claim legal voting residence.
- **©** Block 4.a: Print the complete address where you want your ballot sent usually your current mailing address. The address used must be out of the county of your residence (Block 3).
- **Block 4.c:** This form acts as a request for an absentee ballot by mail or by fax. West Virginia allows military and overseas absentee voters to vote an absentee ballot by fax when available and upon request of the voter. See Section II.D or III.D.
- Block 5: If you do not list a party affiliation, you will vote a nonpartisan ballot in primary elections. You must indicate your political party affiliation when applying for a primary ballot (Example: Democrat, Republican) or write "none" in Block 5 of the FPCA. (The Republican and Democratic Parties have opened up their primaries for unaffiliated voters and those voters not affiliated with n officially recognized party to vote. Contact a local representative for further information on primary voting in West Virginia.) Political party affiliation is not required if only requesting absentee ballots for general elections. If you are currently registered and want to change your political party affiliation or you have previously declined to indicate a political party and you now want to vote in a partisan primary election, you must submit a completed FPCA which includes your new political party affiliation to the local election official not later than 21 days before the election.
- Block 6: Submission of this form serves as a request to receive ballots for all Federal elections held through the

next two regularly scheduled general elections. If you do not wish to receive ballots for that length of time, you may request a ballot for each election for Federal office held in the next election year OR a ballot for only the next scheduled election for Federal office by noting your choice here

© Block 7: Sign and date the FPCA. When signing, you are swearing or affirming that the information is true and correct.

II. UNIFORMED SERVICES

These procedures apply to persons who are U.S. citizens, residents of West Virginia and members of the Uniformed Services and their family members. Uniformed Services are defined as the U.S. Armed Forces, merchant marine, commissioned corps of the Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Persons who are not West Virginia residents are not eligible as a result of their spouses' residence.

A. Registering and Requesting an Absentee Ballot

You should send an FPCA to your local election official early every year and whenever you change your mailing address (see chapter two of this *Guide*).

To register to vote, send a completed FPCA to the Clerk of the County Commission so that it is received not later than the 21st day before the election.

If you are already registered to vote and only wish to request an absentee ballot, send a completed FPCA so that it arrives not earlier than January 1st or 84 days before the election (whichever is earlier) and not later than the sixth day before the election.

B. Casting Your Vote

Ballot Return Deadline: Your ballot will be counted if it is received through the mail before the start of canvassing which occurs on the Friday following a primary and 5 days after a general or special election (Sundays excepted).

The clerk mails out absentee ballots beginning 42 days before an election.

Beginning in 2008, West Virginia will send blank ballots and accept voted ballots by fax from military and overseas voters. This must be arranged upon request through the county clerk. If you choose this method, a waiver that waives all privacy rights is completed by the voter and returned with the ballot. Instructions on returning each ballot is received when the ballot is forwarded to the voter by the county clerk.

You may also use the **Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot.** See instructions in Section II.E.

C. Notary/Witness Requirements

No registration or voting materials are notarized or witnessed.

D. Electronic Transmission of FPCAs and Ballots

- West Virginia allows you to send the FPCA for absentee ballot by fax. If you are registering to vote, the original form must also be mailed.
- West Virginia allows military and overseas absentee voters to receive blank ballots by fax.
- West Virginia allows military and overseas absentee voters to return the voted ballot by fax.

E. Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot

If you are outside the U.S. and have not received your state ballot in a timely manner, use the Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB, SF 186).

West Virginia has expanded the use of the FWAB. The instructions described in chapter two of this *Guide* remain the same, except that West Virginia also allows the FWAB to be used in all Federal, state and local elections.

Use the FWAB only in accordance with the instructions described in Chapter Two and only in those elections mentioned above. Otherwise, your ballot will not be counted.

F. Bars to Registration and Voting

Persons convicted of a felony, treason or election bribery and persons found of unsound mind may not vote.

G. Cancellation of Registration

If a voter does not respond to a confirmation notice, the voter is identified as inactive. If a voter does not vote or otherwise update registration after two general elections following notice, registration is canceled.

H. Action on Registration Requests

A registration receipt is sent. Incomplete applications are returned.

I. Action If Registration Is Denied

Persons denied registration may appeal to the county commission. Consult a legal assistance officer or civilian counsel. Upon denial of your voter registration application or absentee ballot request, West Virginia shall provide you with the reason(s) for the rejection.

J. Voting By Citizens Who Have Never Lived in the U.S.

A U.S. citizen who was born abroad and who is eligible to vote and who has never lived in the U.S. may register and vote in the county where either parent would be eligible to register and vote.

III. CIVILIANS OUTSIDE U.S.

These procedures apply to persons who are U.S. citizens, residents of West Virginia and overseas electors. The term "overseas elector" means a U.S. citizen who resides outside the U.S. and (but for such residence) would be qualified to vote in West Virginia. Persons who are not West Virginia residents are not eligible as a result of their spouses' residence.

- residents of West Virginia temporarily residing outside the U.S. (for local, state and Federal office ballots)
- overseas electors

A. Registering and Requesting an Absentee Ballot

You should send an FPCA to your local election official early every year and whenever you change your mailing address (see chapter two of this *Guide*).

To register to vote, send a completed FPCA to the Clerk of the County Commission so that it has a U.S. postmark date not later than the 21st day before the election.

If you are already registered to vote and only wish to request an absentee ballot, send a completed FPCA so that it arrives not earlier than January 1st or 84 days before the election (whichever is earlier) and not later than the sixth day before the election.

B. Casting Your Vote

Ballot Return Deadline: Your ballot will be counted if it is received through the mail before the start of canvassing which occurs on the Friday following a primary and 5 days after a general or special election (Sundays excepted).

The clerk mails out absentee ballots beginning 42 days before an election.

J. Voting By Citizens Who Have Never Lived in the U.S.

A U.S. citizen who was born abroad and who is eligible to vote and who has never lived in the U.S. may register and vote in the county where either parent would be eligible to register and vote.
