- Improve financing and delivery of clinical preventive services
- Assure that at least 90 percent of people for whom primary care services are provided directly by publicly funded programs are offered screening, counseling, and immunization services
- Increase the proportion of providers offering preventive services
- Increase the proportion of people served by a local health department that assesses and assures access to essential clinical preventive services
- Increase racial and ethnic minority representation in the health professions
