PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY

Changes to commercial management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial and recreational management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, effective at 0001 hours (local time) October 1, 2007.

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their September 10-14, 2007, meeting in Portland, OR. Changes to management measures have been implemented for October 1, and are expected to publish in the *Federal* Register shortly. This notice announces changes for the commercial limited entry trawl and fixed gear fisheries, and for recreational fisheries off Oregon and California. No revisions were made to previously scheduled management measures for the commercial open access fishery or for the Washington recreational fishery.

Commercial Fishery

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

Limited Entry Trawl Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Non-tribal Limited Entry Multi-Species Trawl Fishery

Catch of canary rockfish, particularly in scientific research take, is lower than projected at the start of 2007. Catch of many target species taken in the trawl fishery is also tracking behind pre-season projections. Because canary rockfish optimum yield is projected to remain available as incidental catch through the end of 2007, the Council recommended making inseason revisions to allow fishing communities to have access to healthier stocks that co-occur with canary rockfish. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following October 1 changes to the limited entry trawl Rockfish Conservation Area (RCA) boundaries and trip limits.

Limited Entry Trawl RCA North of 40°10' N. Lat.

 North of Cape Alava (48°10' N. lat.) and between Humbug Mountain (43°20.83' N. lat.) and Cape Arago (42°40.50' N. lat.), the shoreward boundary of the limited entry

trawl RCA is moved to a line approximating the 75-fm (137-m) depth contour, beginning October 1, 2007.

Limited Entry Trawl Trip Limits

As of October 1, 2007, the following trip limit increases are in effect and are provided in Table 3 (North and South,) which is included at the end of this notice:

- Coastwide, increase sablefish trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 22,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1;
- Coastwide, increase Dover sole trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 95,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1;
- Coastwide, increase other flatfish trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 150,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1;
- North of 40°10' N. lat., increase shortspine thornyhead trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 12,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1;
- North of 40°10' N. lat., increase petrale sole trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 40,000 lb per 2 months for the November-December cumulative limit period;
- South of 40°10' N. lat., increase shortspine thornyhead trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 13,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1;
- South of 40°10' N. lat., increase longspine thornyhead trip limits for large and small footrope trawl gear to 25,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1;
- South of 38° N. lat., increase slope rockfish limits for lmited entry trawl gear to 55,000 lb per 2 months from September through December, effective October 1.

Limited Entry Trawl Fishery for Pacific Whiting

On July 26, 2007, West Coast non-tribal Pacific whiting fisheries were closed because the 220 mt bycatch limit for widow rockfish had been achieved. Widow rockfish is primarily taken in the whiting fisheries and 2007 widow rockfish optimum yield remains available to the fisheries. When the Pacific Council reviewed coastwide take of overfished species at its September 2007 meeting, it recommended increasing the widow rockfish bycatch limit, allowing the non-tribal whiting fisheries to reopen until they either achieve their sector-specific whiting allocations, or achieve a nontribal whiting fishery bycatch limit, whichever occurs first. NMFS is implementing the Council's recommended increase in the widow rockfish bycatch limit to 275 mt.

On October 5, 2007, a NMFS final rule will come into effect, implementing catch accounting requirements for Pacific whiting first receivers and processors. In order to ensure that this rule would be in place before the whiting season re-opened, and taking into consideration Council discussions concerning optimal fishery opening days for best tracking catch inseason, NMFS is implementing a whiting fishery re-opening date of **Sunday, October 7, 2007, effective at 0800 hours**, local time.

Catcher vessels expecting to participate in the shore-based sector are advised that they will need to renew their Exempted Fishing Permits (EFPs.) NMFS will be mailing EFPs for the re-opened whiting season shortly after the distribution of this Public Notice. These new EFPs contain new conditions for participating in the fishery through the remainder of the year and are not effective until and unless signed by both the NMFS Northwest Regional Administrator (or his designee) and by the EFP holder.

Limited Entry Fixed Gear Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry fixed gear fishery, see §660.382 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations. The limited entry fixed gear trip limit tables, Table 4 (North) and Table 4 (South), are listed below.

South of 34°27′ N. lat. Shortspine thornyhead landings south of 34°27′ N. lat. continue to run behind projections for 2007. Therefore, effective October 1, 2007, limited entry fixed gear trip limit for this area will be 3,000 lb per 2 months. This is the same limit that was in place for July-August, but is an increase over the previously scheduled limits for September-December.

Recreational Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the recreational fisheries, see §660.384 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Oregon: Recreational fishery catch estimates through July and projections through the end of the year indicate that Oregon's state harvest limit for cabezon of 15.8 mt has been reached. Therefore, effective October 1, 2007 through the end of 2007, cabezon retention is prohibited for recreational fisheries occurring in Federal waters off the state of Oregon (46°16' N. lat. to 42° N. lat.). This action conforms to a state waters closure made by the State of Oregon, which was effective September 22, 2007.

California: Recreational fishery catch estimates through July and projections through the end of the year indicate that the California state harvest limits for yelloweye, canary, and minor nearshore rockfish would be exceeded without action to close certain California recreational fisheries. Therefore, recreational fishing in Federal waters for rockfish, cabezon, greenlings, and lingcod is closed off California from the Oregon/California border at 42° N. lat. to Pigeon Point at 37° 11' N. lat. This action is in effect through the end of 2007; California has taken similar action to close state waters fisheries for these species and fishing areas.

Trip limit tables, effective October 1, 2007, are included at the end of this public notice.
