PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY

Changes to commercial and recreational management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial and recreational management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, effective at 0001 hours (local time) October 1, 2006.

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their September 11-15, 2006, meeting in Foster City, CA. Changes to management measures are being implemented in a *Federal Register* notice that will publish on October 3, 2006, and are described in this public notice.

Commercial Fishery

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

Limited Entry Trawl Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Non-Tribal Limited Entry Trawl Whiting Fishery

Catch of widow rockfish in the non-tribal limited entry trawl whiting fishery is approaching its bycatch limit, but there is still a portion of the whiting allocation remaining. An unexpectedly large widow tow could achieve the bycatch limit and shut down the whiting season prior to fulfillment of the whiting allocation. Because widow is not projected to attain its OY, the bycatch limit will be increased. Also, catch of canary rockfish has been lower than expected in the non-tribal limited entry trawl whiting fishery, while catch from research is much higher than expected. canary, the bycatch limit will be decreased. Therefore, NMFS is implementing an increase in widow rockfish bycatch limit to 220 mt, and a decrease in the canary rockfish bycatch limit to 4.0 mt for the non-tribal limited entry trawl whiting fishery.

Trawl Trip Limits North of 40° 10' N. Lat.

NMFS is increasing the limited entry trawl trip limits for petrale sole and sablefish to allow increased fishing opportunity.

- North of 40° 10' N. lat., increase petrale sole trip limits to 70,000 lb per 2 months for large and small footrope trawl gear during November-December;
- North of 40° 10' N. lat., increase sablefish trip limits to 20,000 lb per 2 months for large and small footrope trawl gear during November-December.

Trawl Trip Limits South of 40° 10' N. Lat.

NMFS is increasing the limited entry trawl trip limits for petrale sole and sablefish to allow increased fishing opportunity.

- South of 40° 10' N. lat., increase petrale sole trip limits to 70,000 lb per 2 months for November-December;
- South of 40° 10' N. lat., increase sablefish trip limits to 20,000 lb per 2 months for November-December.

Limited Entry Fixed Gear and Open Access Fisheries

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry fixed gear and open access fisheries, see §§ 660.382 and 660.383 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Open Access Trip Limits North of 36° N. Lat.

Beginning October 1, NMFS is closing the open access daily/weekly trip limit fishery for sablefish North of 36° N. latitude due to attainment of the open access sablefish allocation. All open access sablefish landings in this area are PROHIBITED until January 1, 2007.

NOTE: If your boat is registered to a Limited Entry Permit, the daily/weekly trip limit closure does not apply to you.

Fixed Gear and Open Access Trip Limits South of 36° N. Lat.

Catch of sablefish is tracking behind schedule for the year South of 36° N. latitude. Therefore, beginning October 1, NMFS is increasing limited entry fixed gear and open access trip limits for sablefish to "500 lb per day, or 1 landing per week of up to 1,050 lb.".

Recreational Fishery

Oregon Recreational

For more detailed regulations applying to recreational, see §§ 660.384 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

In June, ODFW took management action to prevent the "other nearshore rockfish" aggregate from reaching the Oregon state harvest limit by prohibiting the retention of vermilion rockfish in the recreational ocean and estuary boat fisheries. Therefore, in order to conform recreational management measures in federal waters, NMFS is implementing a prohibition on the retention of vermilion rockfish by boat anglers in federal recreational fisheries off Oregon.

Trip limit tables, effective October 1, 2006, are included at the end of this public notice.
