## PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY

Changes to commercial management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, **effective at 0001 hours (local time) August 1, 2007**.

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their June 11-15, 2007, meeting in Foster City, CA. Changes to management measures were implemented for August 1 in a Federal Register notice that published on July 5, 2007 (72 FR 36617), and are described in this public notice.

### **Commercial Fishery**

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

### Limited Entry Trawl Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Non-tribal Limited Entry Trawl Fishery

In April 2007, NMFS expanded the shoreward boundary of the trawl Rockfish Conservation Area

(RCA) north of 40°10' N. lat. and moved the seaward line to shallower water to induce an effort shift to areas seaward of the trawl RCA and reduce impacts on canary rockfish. Effort shifts by limited entry trawl vessels were greater than anticipated, and reductions in effort are necessary to keep darkblotched rockfish below their OY for 2007. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following August 1 changes to the limited entry trawl RCA boundaries, recommended by the Pacific Council.

#### Limited Entry Trawl RCA North of 40°10' N. Lat.

• Between the Columbia River (46°16' N. lat.) and Cascade Head (45°03.83' N. lat.), the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA is shifted seaward to a line approximating the 200 fm depth contour from August 1 through October 31, 2007;

large and small footrope trawl gear north of 40°10' N. lat., Dover sole south of 40°10' N. lat., and chilipepper rockfish taken with small footrope trawl gear south of 40°10' N. lat. Continuing the trawl fishery under current limits is projected to prevent the fishery from obtaining the OYs for these species in 2007. Therefore NMFS has implemented the following August 1 changes in the limited entry trawl fishery, recommended by the Council.

### <u>Limited Entry Trawl Trip Limits</u>

NMFS will be increasing cumulative limits for some species to provide additional opportunity.

- North of 40°10' N. lat., increase longspine thornyhead trip limits using large and small footrope gear to 25,000 lb per 2 months from July through December, effective August 1;
- **South of 40°10' N. lat.**, increase Dover sole trip limits to 80,000 lb per 2 months from July through December, effective August 1;
- South of 40°10' N. lat., increase chilipepper trip limits using small footrope gear to 800 lb per month from August through December.

#### Limited Entry Fixed Gear Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry fixed gear fishery, see §660.382 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations. The limited entry fixed gear trip limit tables, Table 4 (North) and Table 4 (South), are listed below.

Industry reports indicated high discard rates of minor shelf, bocaccio, and widow rockfish in the fixed gear fishery between 40°10' N. lat. and 34°27' N. lat.. Therefore, NMFS has implemented a September 1 change in the limited entry fixed gear fishery, recommended by the Council.

In addition, shortspine thornyhead landings south of 34°27′ N. lat. are behind projections for 2007. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following August 1 change in the limited entry fixed gear fishery, recommended by the Council

# <u>Limited Entry Fixed Gear Fishery South of 40°10'</u> N. Lat.

- Between 40°10' N. lat. and 34°27' N. lat., combine the trip limit for bocaccio and the trip limit for minor shelf rockfish, shortbelly rockfish, and widow rockfish into a single cumulative trip limit of 500 lb per 2 months for: bocaccio, minor shelf rockfish, shortbelly, and widow rockfish from September through December;
- South of 34°27' N. lat., increase shortspine thornyhead trip limits to 3,000 lb per 2 months from July through August, effective August 1.

## Open Access Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the open access fishery, see §660.383 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations. The open access trip limit tables, Table 5 (North) and Table 5 (South), are listed below.

On December 29, 2006 (71 FR 78638), NMFS implemented decreases for the 2007 open access sablefish daily trip limit (DTL) fishery south of 40°10' N. lat.. This was done as a precautionary approach to keep sablefish within their OY in 2007, in the event that the 2007 salmon fisheries were not improved from 2006. The 2007 salmon fisheries are improved from 2006, and the sablefish DTL fishery north of 36° N. lat. remains open and is not currently exceeding 2007 catch projections. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following August 1 change in the open access sablefish DTL fishery, recommended by the Council.

# Open Access Sablefish Daily Trip Limit Fishery South of 40°10' N. Lat.

• **South of 36° N. lat.**, increase sablefish trip limits to 350 lb per day, 1,050 lb per week, from August through December, effective August 1.

# Trip limit tables, effective August 1, 2007, are included at the end of this public notice.
