

LtCol Gina Dorlac, MD, USAF

Lieutenant Colonel Gina R. Dorlac is a 1989 Doctor of Medicine graduate of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. She earned her undergraduate degree in animal physiology from the University of California at Davis in 1985. Following her graduation from USU, Dr. Dorlac completed an internal medicine residency program at Wilford Hall U.S. Air Force Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas, immediately followed by a fellowship in pulmonary and critical care medicine at Wilford Hall. From 1995-1999, Dr. Dorlac was assigned to David Grant U.S. Air Force Medical Center, Travis AFB, California, and later moved to the Joint Trauma Training Center of the Defense Medical Readiness Institute at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas, where she served as director of Critical Care Air Transport Training. In 2002, she participated as a Professional Exchange Program Officer in Santiago, Chile. Two years later, she was assigned to Landstuhl Regional Medical Center where she served as staff, Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine, Medical Director for Critical Care Air Transport, European Command, and Medical Director, Acute Lung Injury Rescue Team. She currently serves as Medical Director, Combined Intensive Care Unit, at Landstuhl, and is also the consultant to the U.S. Air Force Surgeon General for critical care medicine.
