High and low tides on the Bay of Fundy, on April 20, 2001 and September 30, 2002, respectively. Situated between the Canadian provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, the Bay of Fundy is famous for having dramatic differences between its high and low tides. Under typical conditions, high tide at the head (the most inland part) of the Bay of Fundy is as much as 17 m (about 56 ft) higher than low tide.
