



Armenia Compact Progress


- ★ Rural Road Rehabilitation Project: Rehabilitation works continue on a 25 kilometer segment of rural road linking farmers to major agricultural markets in the northern region. By the end of 2008, nine villages will benefit from the new road.
- ★ Irrigation Infrastructure Activity: Repairs to 6,500 meters of irrigation canal that service 1,137 acres of farmland will be complete by fall 2008. The 637 farmers who will benefit from improved irrigation provided 15% of the funds required for the repairs project.
- ★ Water-to-Market Activity: Over 12,000 farmers have been trained in the use of new and improved farming technologies.

- ★ Other Highlights: In 2008, civil society elected, for the second year, new members of the MCA-Armenia stakeholders' committee. The stakeholders' committee is composed of 15 elected civil society representatives. Five of the civil society representatives are nominated to sit on MCA-Armenia's governing council.
- ★ Note: Aspects of this compact are being restructured due to escalating global construction costs and currency fluctuations. Updated program information will be available next quarter.





Benin Compact Progress


- ★ Access to Markets Project: MCA-Benin has completed a Master Plan outlining construction, renovations and upgrades to the Port of Cotonou's operations and infrastructure. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2009.
- ★ Access to Land Project: MCA-Benin began installing seven land survey (GPS) stations to formalize land rights in more than 300 rural villages. Eighty villages have already been selected and a new round of village selection is underway.
- ★ Access to Financial Services Project: In July, President Boni Yayi formally announced the "Challenge Facility," a MCA-funded insti-

- tution which provides grants to support microfinance institutions in Benin.
- ★ Access to Justice Project: MCA Benin signed an accord with the National Assembly to support comprehensive review of drafts of the new Penal and Civil Codes. Passage of the new codes will open the door for construction of nine new courthouses.
- ★ Other Highlights: MCA-Benin signed a \$1.5 million agreement with the Beninese Ministry of Finance to support the Ministry's supervision of over 700 microfinance institutions. MCA-Benin will provide support to the Ministry over the course of four years enabling it to hire more staff and increase financial institution inspections.

Compact At-A-Glance

The five-year, \$307 million compact will increase access to land through more secure tenure, expand access to financial services through grants to enterprises, provide access to justice by bringing courts closer to rural populations and improve access to markets through improvements to the Port of Cotonou.

Compact-Eligible Country Report \star July - September 2008

Proposed Goal

The proposal concentrates on the Northern region of Bolivia in the departments of La Paz, Beni and Pando, and comprises large infrastructure projects to improve major and rural roads, and a smaller project focused on rural productive development.

The main objectives of the proposal are to: 1) increase integration of a region historically isolated from the rest of the country; 2) reduce transportation time/costs while improving road infrastructure to foster greater national and regional interconnectivity; and 3) diversify the Bolivian economy from its reliance on natural gas and mineral resources.

- The Government of Bolivia formally submitted a proposal on September 21, 2007. An initial assessment trip by MCC, originally scheduled for December 2007 was postponed, because of adverse conditions, including unrest surrounding the Constitutional Assembly process.
- MCC has paused its technical engagement with the GOB, and will periodically re-evaluate this decision by monitoring the situation to determine when the enabling environment for Compact development (including economic, political, and social matters) has improved.
- On February 25, 2008, the GOB named Mr. Ramiro Foronda Aliaga as the interim MCA-Bolivia point of contact to replace Graciela Toro, who was named Minister of Planning and Development in January 2008.

Proposed Goal

Burkina Faso's proposed Program is expected to promote economic growth in the rural sector by (i) fostering land tenure security by strengthening the land planning regime, implementing a mediation and conflict resolution mechanism, and formalizing access to land rights; (ii) investing in irrigation and watershed management infrastructure and improving existing agro-industrial supply chains; (iii) constructing national roads and feeder roads.

Update on Progess

- In April 2008, the Investment Memorandum (IM) was presented to the Investment Committee (IC) for discussion and revisions.
- In May 2008, a delegation from the Government of Burkina Faso participated in negotiations with MCC on a five-year, \$480.94 million Compact.
- On June 17, 2008, the Burkina Faso negotiated Compact was approved by the MCC's Board of Directors.
- On July 14, 2008, at a signing ceremony attended by President Blaise
 Compaore, Burkina Faso's Compact was signed by Ambassador Danilovich and Minister Jean Baptiste Compaore, Minister of Economy and
 Finance, and officiated by Secretary Condoleezza Rice.
- On July 14, 2008, after the signing ceremony, a Public Outreach event was held at MCC headquarters. This event was attended by panel members: Ken Hackett, MCC Board member and President for Catholic Relief Services (CRS); Ned Cabot, Strategic Funding Executive for Cisco Systems; and a representative from USAID.

Cape Verde Compact Progress

- ★ Watershed Management and Agricultural Support: The Credit Activity, which seeks to strengthen microfinance institutions to offer quality services to micro and small entrepreneurs and farmers, was launched on June followed by the signing of Memoranda of Understanding with eight local micro-finance institutions interested in receiving technical assistance.
- ★ Infrastructure Project: Asphalting of the 16 km Assomada-Rincao road started in June. This road rehabilitation, scheduled for completion in mid 2009, will benefit the region's population, particularly the 1,000 residents of Rincao, an isolated fishing community.

The HIV-AIDS awareness campaign associated with this road's construction continues. In 2007, staff held 14 education sessions for communities and road workers, which provided information on HIV/AIDS prevention and access to voluntary testing.

- ★ Other Highlights: In July, Cape Verde was admitted as the World Trade Organization's (WTO)153rd member. According to the WTO, membership will allow the archipelago to participate more actively in the global economy, as well as create a more stable base for growth and development.
- ★ Note: This compact is being restructured due to escalating global construction costs and currency fluctuations. Updated program and budget information will be available next quarter.



El Salvador Compact Progress

- ★ Human Development Project: FOMILENIO continues implementation of the Education and Training pilot providing scholarships to 115 post-secondary and middle technical schools students from the Northern Zone in the areas of tourism, agriculture and IT. Two procurements of electrification works are underway for the Community Infrastructure Activity for a total of \$2,410.00.
- ★ Productive Development Project: This project's pilot awarded 10 grants for a total of \$5 million to provide technical assistance and business development services to approximately 1,600 farmers and small businesses in the Northern Zone. The objective is to increase their productivity. Procurement for the project's main implementation contract is underway.
- ★ Connectivity Project: Procurement is underway for the Connectivity Project Manager contract. The procurement process is also

- underway to conduct final design and resettlement action plan for sections of the Northern Transnational Highway.
- ★ Other Highlights: Building on CAFTA and MCC's compact with El Salvador, the US Trade and Development Agency signed three grant agreements totaling \$1.1 million with El Salvador's National Development Commission, the Salvadoran Foundation for Economic and Social Development and the Municipality of Chalatenango. The grants will promote trade and investment in the Northern Zone.

The 3rd outreach event for Salvadorans Living Abroad took place in New York on July 22. This series of events brings together MCC, the Government of El Salvador, FOMILENIO and the private sector to showcase opportunities created through El Salvador's MCC compact.



Georgia Compact Progress

- ★ Agribusiness Development Activity: Over 1,000 grant applications have been received from farmers and businesses. Grants totaling \$3,182,302 have been awarded to 78 agribusiness development projects, creating 1,116 new jobs, improving technologies, facilitating market access, and benefiting some 55,000 rural Georgians.
- ★ Energy Sector Rehabilitation: Under phase I, repairs on the North-South Gas Pipeline have been completed. These repairs at six sites protect the pipeline from corrosion, landslide, and floodwaters. In addition to supplying commercial and residential gas to the entire country, the pipeline also provides gas to an electric power plant.

- ★ Georgia Regional Development Fund: The fund invested \$1.7 million in a construction supply company and approved a \$1.8 million investment in a rural hotel chain. These are the first two grants awarded by the fund.
- ★ Note: This compact has been restructured due to escalating global construction costs and currency fluctuations. MCC and MCG have reallocated \$21.4 million in funds to the Samtskhte-Javakheti road activity (from the Regional Infrastructure Development activity and from savings in program management).





Ghana Compact Progress

- ★ Agriculture Project: The Bank of Ghana, an implementing entity for this project, provided loans totaling \$1,000,000 for the agricultural sector under the Credit Activity. The bank has certified 35 financial institutions to participate in the compact's credit program for farmers.
- ★ Transportation Project: Infrastructure contractors completed the design for the rehabilitation and construction of the ferry dry dock as part of the Improvements to Lake Volta Ferry Services Activity.
- * Rural Development Project: Thirty renovated schools with new desks will be ready for the first day of the next school year. Reno-

- vation of 30 additional flood affected schools in Northern Ghana will begin after the rainy season.
- ★ Other Highlights: MCC and the Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA) agreed to find opportunities to build on each other's work, with Ghana selected as a target country. An initial effort focuses on revising Ghana's seed law to open the market, introducing improved seed varieties.



Honduras Compact Progress

- ★ Transportation Project: President Zelaya recently presided over the ceremony inaugurating road construction for the North Segment of the CA-5 Highway. Resettlement activities planned within the CA-5 Highway Activity are underway. Affected both parties alongside the North Segment have started to receive indemnification payments.
- ★ Rural Development Project: More than 2,600 farmers are receiving technical assistance and training in areas such as best agricultural practices and integrated pest management
 - Thirty four concept papers were received for the second round of the Agricultural Public Goods Grant Facility. It seeks to award a total of \$3.2 million in grants in this round to selected projects aimed at increasing the productivity of Honduran farmers.


- ★ Other Highlights: During a recent visit to Honduras, Deputy Secretary of State John Negroponte participated in a MCA-H event to publicly acknowledge the proposed co-financing by the Central American Bank for Economic Integration (CABEI) of the CA-5 Highway. The event highlighted the commitment of the Honduran Ministry of Finance, MCC and CABEI to cooperate to successfully conclude the proposed CABEI co-financing.
- ★ Note: The transportation project in this compact has been restructured due to escalating global construction costs and an expansion of the construction works required. CABEI has approved a \$130 million loan for the government of Honduras to co-finance the additional costs of the improvements to the CA-5 Highway planned in the compact.



Compact-Eligible Country Report 🛨 July-September 2008

- In December 2007, the MCC Board of Directors re-selected Jordan to be eligible for MCC Compact funding. Jordan improved its performance on the MCC eligibility indicators, improving from fail to pass in "Girl's Primary Education and Trade Policy."
- In April 2008, Jordan completed a constraints analysis and a sector analysis that highlighted key challenges to long-term, sustainable economic growth in Jordan.
- In April and May, Jordan conducted a broad, participatory consultative
 process that included town hall meetings in each of the country's twelve
 governorates. This process provided opportunities for a cross section of
 citizens, civil society organizations and the private sector to share issues,
 concerns, and potential investment ideas.
- Jordan is currently developing "concept papers" that define potential projects to address one or more of the problems identified through the constraints analysis, sector analysis and consultative process.
- Since early 2007, Jordan's Threshold Program has been advancing customs reform and improvements in municipal governance. The on-going program is managed by USAID.

Lesotho Compact Progress

- ★ Program Set-Up: The MCA-Lesotho Board of Directors and the Stakeholders Committee have been established. In addition, the MCA Board of Directors has recruited a CEO and eight senior MCA staff. Thirteen procurements totaling \$14.5 have been signed, mostly pertaining to MCA setup.
- ★ Private Sector Development Project: Procurement is underway for goods and services related to a number of private sector development initiatives, including reforms in credit law and regulations, land information and registration systems, legal systems, and the establishment of the Land Administration Authority.

In June, MCA-Lesotho sponsored a National Identity Card workshop to launch a program providing national identity cards to all Basotho aged 15 years and older. The database resulting from this program will be linked to all public records and used to promote

access to financial credit to facilitate economic growth both regionally and within Lesotho.

Another MCA-sponsored workshop attended by civil society, private sector, local government and parliamentary representatives launched the development of a new National Land Administration Authority.

★ Other Highlights: MCA and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) under the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) co-sponsored the National Laboratory Policy and Strategic Plan workshop that took place from June 9-12 in Maseru. Attended by representatives of the Government of Lesotho, NGOs, international agencies and technical experts, the workshop resulted in a national laboratory strategy. This initiative directly benefits the MCC funded construction of a new National Reference Laboratory under the compact's Health Sector Project that will serve the entire country.

Madagascar Compact Progress

- ★ Land Tenure Project: MCA-Madagascar is currently restoring and digitizing 88,000 land tenure documents, including land titles, cadastre plans and landowner personal records, in 10 of the country's 29 regional land service offices. These documents will be entered into a country-wide land management database. A total of 19 land management offices are operational and have issued 3,300 land certificates, securing land rights for 2,000 families.
- ★ Finance Project: MCA-Madagascar has signed four contracts with IT firms to implement the \$8 million national inter-bank payment system. Assistance to the National Savings Bank in modernizing its information management system and opening new branches is helping increase the bank's capacity to provide faster and more comprehensive services to its clientele as well as expand access to banking services.
- ★ Agricultural Business Investment Project: Over 20,000 farmers and 77 small businesses have received technical assistance under

- the program. MCA-Madagascar has also assisted farmer groups in mobilizing microfinance loans worth \$625,000.
- ★ Other Highlights: The Malagasy government recently held a "Friends of Madagascar" roundtable with high-level representatives from donor agencies. The conference's objective was to promote the Madagascar Action Plan (MAP)—the government's national poverty reduction strategy—and encourage support for its implementation.
- ★ Note: The Millennium Challenge Corporation signed its first and only four-year Compact with the Government of Madagascar in April 2005. The Compact was amended in July 2008 to extend its term by one additional year. The extension of the Compact term is intended to allow a more complete achievement of the goals set out in the Compact and enhance sustainability of its investments.

Compact-Eligible Country Report *July-September 2008

Compact Status

- The Vice President for Compact Development made the initial trip to Malawi on January 14, 2008. He met with the president, cabinet, donor heads of mission, NGOs & civil society groups, media and private sector.
- In mid-March 2008, the Government of Malawi named Mr. Kakhobwe as the point of contact to lead their core team in the compact development process in conjunction with Mr. Alex Gomani as the Chief Economist.
- MCC conducted its initial technical visit from April 13-26 to work with the core team in planning the constraints analysis and consultative process.
- The consultative process is commencing the first week of July and the constraints analysis is to be finalized in August.
- MCC's Capacity Building Program has been established for eligible countries to receive assistance, not only in carrying out compact development and implementation more expeditiously, but also to better manage development results. Malawi will receive funding for capacity building in procurement as this is a critical need identified in Malawi's National Capacity Development Program. The RFP for capacity building was sent out Tuesday, June 24th. The expected award date is November 2008.
- Malawi's two-year \$20.9 million threshold program, focused on anticorruption reforms, will conclude in June 2008.

Mali Compact Progress

★ Alatona Irrigation Project: Procurement actions are underway to procure goods and services for agricultural systems development, and irrigation design and supervision. Technical documents are being prepared for the forthcoming procurement process for construction of the Alatona irrigation and social infrastructures, including resettlement and land allocation.

The procurement process has begun for the Niono- Goma Coura road construction and supervision contracts have started, with construction to begin by the end of 2008.

★ Bamako-Senou Airport Improvement Project: Runway and airport terminal design and construction supervision procurements will start this quarter. Construction is projected to begin in mid 2009.

★ Other Highlights: Over 75 stakeholders, including various ministries and experts, attended a design workshop in Bamako to discuss their vision for the proposed Bamako Senou International Airport. Their input will inform the Design Brief to be submitted to the company in charge of the airport's design.


MCC's new partnership with the Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA) is solidifying and will expand opportunities for Alatona farmers and boost private sector capacities in post-harvest systems and value-added processing.

Compact-Eligible Country Report 🛨 July-September 2008

- The Government of Moldova has identified the political and technical points of contact to serve as MCC's partners in the compact development process, and has formed an MCA unit to perform necessary analysis for Moldova's compact proposal to the MCC.
- The Moldovan core team submitted analyses of the country's economy and industry sectors. Input solicited from donors, members of the private sector and other members of the general public is included in the final reports, which are available at the Government of Moldova's MCA website.
- The Government of Moldova concluded the first phase of its consultative process on July 26, 2007, with a conference in Ungheni. On September 12, 2007, the U.S. Embassy in Chisinau hosted an event where all of Moldova's political parties were invited to hear more about MCC's processes and the results of the Moldovan MCA unit's analyses and consultative process. On October 24, 2007, the National Monitoring Committee for the Compact Development Process approved the preliminary components of the country proposal. The second phase of the public consultations, framed around the approved preliminary components, took place in November 2007. Holding public consultations are an ongoing process throughout compact development and into implementation.
- The Moldovan government submitted their proposal to MCC on February 28, 2008 that included four projects: Rehabilitation of the Road Network, Transition to High Value Agriculture, Energy Sector Efficiency Growth, and Rural Primary Health Care.
- After thoroughly reviewing the proposal, undertaking an internal peer review, consulting with donors, counterparts, key stakeholders, and fielding of a twoweek mission with multiple technical specialists, MCC decided to move forward with developing the proposed Rehabilitation of the Road Network and Transition to High Value Agriculture projects.
- The MCC team is working closely with the core team and stakeholders to further develop the two projects utilizing 609(g) funding, regarding which Congress was notified in July 2008.
- In early June 2008, Moldova was classified as a Tier 3 country in the United States Department of State's 2008 Trafficking in Persons Report, and was provided an action plan for addressing this issue. Failure to improve Moldova's classification would have very serious consequences on MCC's ability to continue work with Moldova. Mongolia Compact Progress

- ★ Program Set-Up: MCA-Mongolia completed the process of hiring all 12 of its senior positions and held a compact implementation workshop in May in which MCC and MCA staff worked together on implementation planning.
 - MCA-Mongolia signed Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) with the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, as well as with the Ministry of Construction and Urban Development for cooperation and coordination during project implementation.
 - The MCA-Mongolia Board have been meeting monthly and recently approved an MOU with the Ministry of Health for collaboration in the implementation of the Health Project.

- ★ Railroad Project: Procurements are underway for the following services: rail project manager, rail audit, environmental and social oversight consultant, and environmental impact assessment.
- ★ Other Highlights: The national railway joint venture "UBTZ" agreed to key initial conditions precedent to compact funding of the rail project, including allowing audits of its financial accounting in order to move toward adherence to International Accounting Standards.





Morocco Compact Progress

- ★ Program Set-Up: The Director General of the MCC implementing entity has been appointed after a competitive recruitment, and recruitment is underway for other key director positions with the Agency of Partnership for Progress (APP), the organization responsible for implementing the Morocco compact.
- ★ Major procurements related to all five project activities have been released. Morocco signed its first project-related contract in May and feasibility and environmental studies for the Fruit Tree Productivity Project have begun
- ★ Other Highlights: The Ministry of Economy and Finance, which is coordinating compact activities until the APP is operational,

received approval for its second disbursement request totaling \$5 million.

In April, in Meknes, before His Majesty King Mohamed VI, Minister of Agriculture Aziz Akhannouch unveiled the broad outlines of a long-awaited agricultural strategy, known as the "Green Morocco Plan." In his presentation, Minister Akhannouch singled out the MCC compact for particular praise, terming it a "model" for agricultural development that would be replicated more widely.



- ★ Farmer Income Support Project: Two contracts have been signed, including one to produce a detailed aerial survey of areas affected by Coconut Lethal Yellowing Disease and another to grow the first of two coconut crops that will replace diseased trees.
- ★ Other Highlights: To foster participation and consultation in compact implementation, MCC and MCA have held a series of

workshops and events with key stakeholders including donors, private sector, civil society and public institutions.

In August 2007, the Council of Ministers approved the Water Sector Policy including water resources management strategy, national water policy and water allocation licensing regulation. This is a key policy reform under the compact.



Namibia's Compact Proposal seeks to reduce poverty through economic growth and foster economic transformation. The proposed program aims to achieve this goal in two ways: increasing the competence of the Namibian workforce (knowledge, skills and attitude), and increasing the productivity of (on-farm and off-farm) enterprises in rural areas. Key sectors proposed include: Education, Agriculture (livestock and indigenous natural products), and Community Based Tourism.

Update on Progress

- In December 2007, the MCC Board of Director re-selected Namibia to be eligible for MCC Compact funding.
- On June 12, 2008, MCC's Investment Committee made a recommendation to its Chief Executive Officer to submit the negotiated Compact to MCC's Board of Directors for approval.
- From June 16 20, a delegation from the Government of Namibia participated in negotiations with MCC on a five-year, \$304.5 million Compact.
- On July 10, 2008, MCC's Board of Directors approved the proposed Compact and signing is expected to take place on July 28, 2008.
- The transaction team and MCA-Namibia are continuing to work on due diligence of the project components in preparation for implementation and management of the Compact.

Nicaragua Compact Progress

- ★ Transportation Project: Procurement is underway for the Villanueva-Guasaule road segment of the Pan-American Highway and the secondary roads between León-Poneloya and Cinco Pinos-Somotillo.
- ★ Property Regularization Project: Surveying and tenure regularization for 800 parcels has begun as part of this project's pilot. Land titles issued for the 800 parcels will add to the 1,226 titles already issued. A Property Conflict Mediation Center opened in León to resolve disputes through mediated negotiation.
- ★ Rural Development Project: 1,772 farmers have prepared agriculture, livestock and non-agricultural business plans to obtain fund-

ing aiming at increasing their productivity and improving links to markets. Plans selected by MCA-Nicaragua's investment committee will receive funding under the project. Sesame seed producers saw a 130% increase in income during the last harvest cycle thanks to technical assistance and access-to-market support.


★ Other Highlights: The Nicaraguan Government invited MCA-Nicaragua to host a "National Earth Festival" in June. National government, municipal government, civil society, and private sector representatives attended the event. The event served as a space for dialog and collective action where representatives from various organizations joined forces against environmental degradation. MCA's contribution to reforestation and natural resources conservation was highlighted.

Compact Status

- In March 2008, the MCC Board of Directors selected the Philippines to be eligible for Compact funding based on its consistent performance on eligibility indicators, and its effective implementation of the MCC-funded Threshold Program.
- The Philippines has established a dedicated "Millennium Challenge Unit" within the Ministry of Finance to develop a proposal for MCC investments.
- The Philippines has completed a technical analysis of its constraints to economic growth, a first step towards a proposal.
- The Millennium Challenge Unit will be conducting a consultative process with a broad cross section of the society shortly. This process will provide opportunities for citizens, civil society organizations and the private sector to share issues, concerns, and potential investment ideas.
- Following the consultations, the Philippines will develop "concept papers" that define potential projects to address one or more of the problems identified through the Constraints Analysis and Consultative Process.
- Since early 2007, the Philippines' Threshold Program has been enhancing anti-corruption efforts by strengthening the Office of the Ombudsman, improving revenue administration and increasing enforcement capacity within the Department of Finance. The on-going program is managed by USAID.

Tanzania Compact Progress

- ★ Program Set-Up: MCA-Tanzania is now fully staffed and currently completing preparatory work necessary for successful implementation of compact activities.
- ★ Transport Sector Project: Representatives from the US Army
 Corps of Engineers, Tanzania National Roads Agency, MCATanzania, and MCC recently traveled to the field to inspect the
 Tunduma-Sumbawanga and Mtwara Corridor road segments to
 be rehabilitated as part of the compact. The mission produced
 a detailed technical and environmental assessment that will be
 instrumental in finalizing the road design documents.
- In May, MCA-Tanzania held a kick-off meeting for a strategic environmental assessment of Mafia Island that must be completed prior to starting the island's airport rehabilitation project.
- ★ Other Highlights: In June, President Kikwete signed the new Electricity Act, which replaces the previous 67 year old legislation. The passage of this act, which represents a more market-oriented approach to the energy sector, is a condition precedent for funding the Energy Sector Project under the compact and will ultimately help ensure the sustainability of MCC and other energy investments in Tanzania.





- MCC conducted an initial visit to Ukraine from January 18-24, 2007 to discuss the MCC compact development process with the Government of Ukraine and other key stakeholders and to describe next steps.
- A second visit took place from March 11–17, 2007 during which the MCC delegation met with the regional governments of Lviv, Odessa, Dnepropetrovsk, and the Autonomous Republic of Crimea. This visit focused on raising awareness of MCC's existing threshold program in Ukraine and of Ukraine's eligibility to participate in MCC's compact program. The visit also focused on engaging the regional governments, NGOs and private sector leaders in the compact development process.
- During a visit from July 7–10, 2007 MCC's Vice President of Operations


- ★ Transportation Infrastructure Project: MCA-Vanuatu has signed a \$54 million design and build contract for the construction of the Efate Ring Road and segments of the Santo East Coast Road. Survey and design work for the Efate Ring Road have already started and construction is expected to begin in August. Environmental, social and resettlement assessments required by the compact are underway.
- ★ Institutional Strengthening: MCA has initiated the procurement process for maintenance equipment for the Public Works Department. This equipment will help increase the department's maintenance capacity and ensure the longevity of the projects.

- ★ Other Highlights: MCC has obtained baseline data from household income and expenditure, tourism, and roadside enterprise surveys, among others. This information will be used to measure the compact's performance.
- ★ Note: This project has undergone restructuring due to escalating global construction costs and currency fluctuations. MCC will fund up to 70% of the road rehabilitation planned in the compact with a focus on the two main islands of Vanuatu. MCC has actively supported Government of Vanuatu in negotiations with other donors to possibly finance the remaining project components.


