


Congressman Wolf, the most senior of the 11 members of the House of Representatives from Virginia, is serving in his 14th term in Congress. He represents the 10th District of Virginia, which stretches from McLean to Winchester.

Congressman Wolf sits on the powerful House Appropriations Committee, where he is the senior Republican on the State and Foreign Operations subcommittee. He also serves on the Transportation and Housing and Urban Development subcommittee.

Congressman Wolf was born in 1939 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He received his B.A. degree from Penn State University in 1961 and his law

degree from Georgetown University in 1965. He lives in Vienna with his wife, Carolyn. They have five adult children and 13 grandchildren.



Columbia Baptist Church was founded in 1858 by a group of seven men and women, and the first building for worship services was located on Broad Street and referred to as "the old box church." This first building was used as a hospital for soldiers during the Civil War; by the turn of the century, the church listed more than 100 members. In 1910, a new building was dedicated on the site of the current Hodge Chapel. The buildings and additions at the current site have grown as the church community has grown, as can be seen in the new brick sanctuary (1956), additional education space (added in 1956 and again in 1963), as well as the Children's Building (1987).

Columbia Baptist Church cooperates with the Baptist World Alliance (whose offices are located across the street from CBC), the Southern Baptist Convention, the Virginia Baptist General Association, and Northstar Church Network. In the past 30 years, the CBC has begun numerous ministries, including a retreat center, child development center, ESL classes, a partnership with Central Baptist Church in Moscow, the Columbia Center for Missions, the John Leland center for Theological Studies, and worship services in Russian, Vietnamese, Korean and Spanish. The current pastor is Dr. James E. Baucom, Jr., who has been with the congregation since 2003.

Located on the corner of Lee Highway (Rt. 29) and W. Columbia Street Directions:

From Washington, DC and Arlington area: I-66 West to Sycamore Street. Exit right on Sycamore, proceed to 2nd traffic light; turn left on Rt. 29 South (Lee Hwy/Washington Street). Proceed on

Rt. 29 South approximately 6 blocks to church on right at W. Columbia Street.

From I-495 (the "Beltway"): Take exit 49B onto I-66

East (toward Washington). Exit I-66 at Rt. 29 South (Lee Hwy/Washington Street); immediately move to right lane. Turn right onto Rt. 29 South (Lee Hwy/Washington Street) at traffic signal. Proceed approximately 3 blocks to church on right at W. Columbia Street.
