Seattle is one zone, the rest of King County the other. The Seattle city limits is the zone line. A transfer is issued only when fare is paid. Peak-hour trips are shaded on Metro's printed timetables.





All Metro buses are equipped with bicycle racks. Each rack holds two or three bicycles. Bicyclists can transport their bikes on any Metro bus on a first-come, first-served basis. No additional fare is required. Bicycles may be loaded or unloaded at any bus stop at any time, except on streets in the Ride Free Area between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. During these hours, loading and unloading bikes is

restricted to a route's first and last stop in the Ride Free Area.

When the Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel is open, bicycles may be loaded and unloaded

in all tunnel stations at any

time. Please walk your bike in tunnel stations and use elevators or stairs to transport your bike between levels. Bikes are not allowed on

escalators. While waiting for a bus, stand at the head of the bus bay behind the yellow textured strip until the bus comes to a complete stop. Use caution when stepping between the platform and the roadway.
