

## Workforce Investment System

The Departments of Labor and Defense are partnering to provide information about a wide range of resources and services that are available to BRAC-impacted workers. These include:

• **One-Stop Career Centers** are single points of access for local, state, and national employment information, training, and related supportive services. • **BRAC Coach** (www.BRAC-coach.org) identifies common problems facing workers likely to be affected by BRAC and provides step-by-step instructions for locating helpful resources.

• America's Career Infonet (www.acinet.org) houses national, state, and local labor market data, as well as skills assessment tools, a Career Resource Library, a database of more than 11,000,000 employers, and a link to state web sites.

• **Career Voyages** (www.careervoyages.gov) provides career information on highgrowth industries and high-demand occupations. It features career videos; links to job descriptions and jobs; links to skills, education, and training requirements; and other specialized resources.

• **Occupational Information Network** (http://online.onetcenter.org) enables job seekers to easily identify occupations of interest, analyze their readiness for particular occupations, and create resumes to generate employer interest.

• **Military Spouse Resource Center** (www.milspouse.org) provides military spouses the best available tools to aid in their search for employment, education, and other relevant community resources (e.g., child care and transportation).

• **National Emergency Grants** enable state governments to expand services in response to significant worker dislocations due to BRAC.
