YEAR 2000 OBJECTIVES

- Confine incidence of diagnosed AIDS cases
- Confine prevalence of HIV infection
- >> Encourage adolescent postponement of sexual intercourse
- Increase condom usage
- Increase the proportion of drug abusers in treatment programs
- Increase the proportion of intravenous drug abusers using uncontaminated drug paraphernalia
- ▶Reduce transfusion-transmitted HIV infection
- Increase testing for HIV infection
- Increase primary care and mental health care provider counseling on HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases
- Increase HIV education in schools
- Provide HIV education in colleges and universities
- Increase outreach to drug abusers
- Increase the proportion of clinics that screen, diagnose, treat, counsel, and provide partner notification services for HIV infection and bacterial sexually transmitted diseases (STDs)
- Reduce occupational exposure to bloodborne infections
- Increase abstention from sexual activity among sexually active adolescents
- Increase the proportion of businesses that implement HIV/AIDS education programs
- ⇒Increase linkages between primary care clinics and substance abuse treatment programs


