- ➣ Reduce selected illnesses among international travelers
- Reduce bacterial meningitis
- > Reduce infectious diarrhea among children
- > Reduce acute middle ear infections among children
- > Reduce pneumonia-related days of restricted activity
- Increase levels of immunization
- ➣ Reduce postexposure rabies treatments
- > Expand immunization laws
- Increase immunization counseling and immunizations by primary care providers
- Improve financing and delivery of immunizations
- > Increase provision of adult immunization by public health departments
- Increase tuberculosis identification by local health departments
- Increase the number of tuberculosis patients who completed course of preventive therapy
- > Increase laboratories with technologies for rapid viral diagnosis of influenza
