- Reduce pregnancies among adolescents
- ☼ Reduce unintended pregnancies
- Reduce the prevalence of infertility
- Encourage postponement of sexual activity among adolescents
- Increase abstention from sexual activity among sexually active adolescents
- Increase the use of contraception that both effectively prevents pregnancy and provides barrier protection against disease among sexually active young people
- Increase the effectiveness with which family planning methods are used
- Improve discussion of human sexuality
- Increase counseling about pregnancy options
- Increase availability of appropriate preconception care and counseling
- Increase appropriate counseling and referral services for HIV infection and STDs
- Increase contraceptive use among all females aged 15–44
