Several P3 winners have already taken their innovations to new levels – including starting successful businesses, winning additional awards, and providing help to developing countries.

The request for ideas will be open from August 21 – December 21, 2006. This is your chance to create an interdisciplinary team that can work to solve sustainability challenges in the United States and around the world. It also gives you the opportunity to compete with other student teams across the nation for EPA's P3 Award, an award that includes additional funding up to \$75,000 to further develop your design, implement your project in the field, and move it to the marketplace.
