The District proposed a reopening and significant permit revision for this facility on December 15, 2005. The main purpose of the reopening (Application # 10393) was to incorporate the NESHAP requirements for MSW Landfills. In addition, the District proposed to combine several tables and to modify a number of permit conditions to make this permit more consistent with Title V permits for other similar facilities. The main purposes of the significant revision (Application # 11385) were to add a new flare and to revise several concentration and emission limits. The District also proposed to allow an expansion of the landfill gas collection system. This significant revision resulted in the following emission increases: 66.6 tons/year of CO, 33.3 tons/year of SO₂, 20.0 tons/year of NO_x, 11.2 tons/year of PM₁₀, 3.6 tons/year of POC, and 6.5 tons/year of HAPs.

The public comment period ended on January 20, 2006. The EPA comment period ended on January 29, 2006. No comments on this proposed reopening and significant revision were received from the public, EPA, or the facility.
