- Winners will be selected at the sole discretion of the Education, Arts & Culture (EAC) judges, and all decisions are final.
- This contest may be modified or cancelled without notice at any time by EAC.
- All entries become the property of the EAC. Participants must have a parent's or legal guardian's permission to enter this contest.
- Regardless of the form of entry, the parent or legal guardian of each participant under age 18 must submit a signed statement, in writing, attesting that he or she has read, understood, and agrees to these contest rules and that such agreement constitutes acceptance of these contest rules on behalf of his or her child and him or herself. Entries without the necessary consent of a parent or legal guardian will not be accepted.
