
returns this year, starting at 4th and Townsend St. at 10 a.m. and heading down Market St. to the auditorium.

## New BART schedule starts 2008 right

33% more service nights and Sundays

The new year brings a new and improved BART schedule with more frequent service for hundreds of thousands of passengers – especially those riding at night, on weekends and on the SFO and Millbrae lines.

The new schedule, effective January 1 includes:

- More trains after 7 p.m. Monday-Saturday and all day Sunday. During these times trains will run every 15 minutes, instead of every 20 minutes, increasing service by 33%.
- If your trip is served by two BART lines, trains will depart approximately every seven minutes.
- The popular Pittsburg/Bay Point line will serve SFO directly.
- Earlier start time for weekday service to SFO from downtown San Francisco.
- Shorter commute times from Millbrae to downtown San Francisco.
- Double the service for South San Francisco and San Bruno stations.

## **BART fares increase Jan. 1**

Effective Tuesday, January 1, BART fares will increase by 5.4%

This is the second in a series of inflation-based fare increases approved by the BART Board of Directors in May 2003. As a result, fares increase on January 1 of even years until 2012. The first increase occurred on January 1, 2006.

The increase is based on a formula that accounts for changes in inflation, both nationally and locally, reduced by .5% to account for BART's increased operating efficiencies.

The minimum fare will increase from \$1.40 to \$1.50. Most riders will see between a 10 cent and 30 cent fare increase.

For the ninth consecutive year, BART will provide a limited number of commemorative Martin Luther King Day Flash Passes, distributed free through the Northern California Martin Luther King, Jr. Birthday Observance Committee. Flash passes are good for BART rides to and from the event. For flash pass information, call 510/268-3777, or order your flash passes online at norcalmlk.org.

## Corrections to published BART schedules

The new BART schedule, effective January 1, omits two trains from the "Fares and Schedules" brochure, platform schedules and the web and mobile QuickPlanners on bart.gov.

Both trains are on the SFO to Pittsburg/Bay Point line's Saturday schedule. The first train departs Powell Street at 5:53 a.m., arriving at Pittsburg/Bay Point at 6:49 a.m., making all stops in between. The second train departs Daly City at 5:38 a.m., arriving at Pittsburg/Bay Point at 7:09 a.m., making all stops in between.

Also, the "Service/Route Overview" on page

5 of the "Fares and Schedules" brochure is incorrect. There is no weekday evening service on the Richmond to Daly City line. There is no evening service on the Fremont to Daly City line on weekdays or Saturday.

In addition, arrivals at Dublin/Pleasanton Station may be slightly later than the published schedules, due to the construction of a new station in West Dublin/Pleasanton. Connecting bus services have been rescheduled accordingly.

We will be updating all of the published schedules to reflect these changes.
