

Diversity Programs at Brookhaven

Two important assets the Laboratory holds are the diversity of programs within its multidisciplinary structure and the diversity of the people it employs. It is the combination of talent, energy, commitment and dedication that fuels Brookhaven's ability to excel in basic and applied research at the frontier of science and technology. Brookhaven encourages a diverse environment that welcomes a healthy exchange of ideas and different viewpoints, and maintains a number of programs that provide multi-level opportunities for women and minorities including:

Professional Program For Women and Minorities:

This one-year program provides the associate with an opportunity to gain experience and acquire skills in science, engineering or administration.

Technician Program For Women and Minorities:

A two-year internship for individuals who have completed a minimum of an AAS degree in the fields of electrical, electromechanical, or mechanical technology. Participants will gain hands on technical and science experience while working under the guidance and support of professional staff members who will serve as mentors.

Technician Training Program For Women and Minorities:

Provides on-the-job training for those who are pursuing a career in the field of electro-mechanical technology. The trainee will



learn and assist in the development and maintenance of beamline instrumentation during this two-year program.

General Consortium for Graduate Degrees for Minorities:

This fellowship provides opportunities for students to obtain a master's degree in engineering through a program of paid summer internships.

Employment Opportunities For Individuals with Disabilities:

Gives individuals an opportunity to acquire skills and experience in science, engineering or administration during a six and one-half month term appointment.

Science and Engineering Programs For Women and Minorities:

On-the-job training for undergraduate students. Participants in the 10-12 week program are mentored by members of the scientific, administrative, or technical staff and given research experience in various areas of chemistry, physics, computer science, engineering, biology, nuclear medicine, applied mathematics, high and low energy accelerators and scientific writing as well as nonscientific areas.

Laboratory Assistance Program

Brookhaven is the home of the Career and Employment Institute's (CEI) 15-week Laboratory Assistance Program. CEI assists individuals with disabilities reach entry-level positions in clinical, pharmaceutical, environmental and research laboratories.



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
