Public Comment Period Begins

Kirby Canyon Landfill Gets Preliminary OK for Title V Permit

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District has made a preliminary decision to grant a Title V permit to the Kirby Canyon Landfill, located at 910 Coyote Creek Golf Drive in San Jose. The Kirby Canyon Landfill is an active 311-acre site located approximately 15 miles south of downtown San Jose, adjacent to U.S. Highway 101. It is equipped with an active landfill gas collection system that is vented to control equipment.

The public comment period is from April 15, 2003 until May 21, 2003. During the public comment period, any member of the public may comment on any aspect of the proposed permit. A copy of the proposed permit can be found:

What is Title V?

Title V is part of the 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act, and requires all state and local governments to develop and implement operating permits for all major pollution emitting facilities. The EPA oversees these permit programs and the Air District is charged with implementing them in the Bay Area, in accordance with Federal guidelines.

Title V is intended to clarify the complex air quality permitting process by consolidating the multitude of federal, state, and local air pollution control regulations into one summary operating permit that covers all aspects of a facility's year-to-year air pollution activities. The Title V operating permit program is implemented under Air District Regulation 2, Rule 6. Public comment is important to the Title V process. A final decision will incorporate consideration of public comments on the proposal.
