What is parole?

Parole is any form of conditional supervision in the community following confinement in a State or Federal correctional facility. Violations of the condition of supervision during this period may result in a sentence to confinement or a return to confinement. Included are those persons who have been conditionally released by a parole board, by mandatory supervised released, or by other means (e.g. emergency sentence roll-backs and court-ordered releases).

What agencies are included in this census?

- **INCLUDE** your agency on this form if on June 30, 2006 it supervised parolees sentenced as an adult, who had been conditionally released to parole supervision by parole board decision or by mandatory conditional release.
- **INCLUDE** only one agency per form. (Each independent agency which supervised adult parolees such as an independent County agency, an agency serving a group of Counties, or a Community Corrections Act agency should fill out a separate form.)
- **INCLUDE** your agency if it also supervised juveniles on parole/aftercare, adults on probation, juveniles on probation, or other correctional populations, regardless of conviction status.
- EXCLUDE your agency if it only supervised probationers.
- EXCLUDE your agency if it only supervised juveniles.
