DEFINITION OF STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

The definition of STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT is based on "Training for Investigators of Staff Sexual Misconduct," prepared by the National Institute of Corrections. STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT includes any behavior or act of a sexual nature directed toward a juvenile or youthful offender by an employee, counselor, instructor, volunteer, official visitor, or agency representative. Romantic relationships between staff and youth are included in this definition.

Consensual or non-consensual sexual acts including:

Intentional touching of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or buttocks with the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;

Completed, attempted, threatened, or requested sexual acts;

OR

Occurrences of indecent exposure, invasion of privacy, or staff voyeurism for sexual gratification.

DEFINITION OF STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The definition of STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT was also developed by the National Institute of Corrections. STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT includes repeated verbal statements or comments of a sexual nature to a juvenile or youthful offender by an employee, counselor, instructor, volunteer, official visitor, or agency representative.

Demeaning references to gender or derogatory comments about body or clothing;

- Profane or obscene language or gestures.
