I. Introduction

This appendix describes the activities to be undertaken and the results to be achieved with the funds obligated under this Agreement. Nothing in this Appendix A shall be construed as amending any of the definitions, conditions, or terms of the Agreement.

II. Background

The Lubulima Agricultural Commercial and Cooperative Union (LACCU), an organization of six cooperatives and one women's club, produces fresh vegetables and sells them to an exporter for the market in the United Kingdom. The market for fresh vegetables is growing in Europe. In addition, the expansion of supermakets in Zambia is increasing local demand for fresh produce. LACCU would like to pursue a growth expansion strategy to capture more of the export and local market for fresh vegetables. However, the company must first strengthen its planning, management, and marketing capacity.

III. Funding

A. ADF Contribution

The financial plan for ADF's contribution is set forth in Appendix A-1 to this Agreement. The Parties may make changes to the financial plan without formal amendment, if such changes are made in accordance with Article 7 of the Agreement and do not cause ADF's contribution to exceed the obligated amount specified in Article 3, Section 3.1 of the Agreement.

LACCU will contribute its assets, which include a vehicle and membership dues collected during the life of the project.

LACCU's members will contribute the use of their land for the crop cultivation.

Such modalities include production contracts between LACCU and cooperatives and contracts between the cooperatives and the farmers. In addition, the TA will develop an extension program for LACCU that includes scheduled monthly activities. The field operations production system will also include preparation of a manual on the modalities of the input revolving fund.

Financial management. LACCU will engage a TA to work closely with the business manager to establish basic business administrative policies, quality

LACCU will conduct a marketing tour of at least two countries in the region to identify possible market opportunities.

The staff and elected leadership of LACCU are responsible for the management and the proper implementation of the Project.

ZATAC, ADF's partner in Zambia, will provide training in the areas of management, ADF reporting, corporate and cooperative governance, and business planning. ZATAC will also provide technical assistance to the members and the cooperative's leadership in those areas.

IX. Monitoring and Evaluation

Within sixty days of the effective date of this Agreement, the Grantee will form a monitoring and assessment committee composed of a representative cross-section of the Grantee's organization. The committee will develop a Project monitoring plan. In addition, during implementation, the committee will have responsibility for ensuring that the Project follows the implementation plan, and that problems identified through monitoring and evaluation are properly addressed in a timely manner.
