
## Infants Can Choke On Plastic Decals From Baby Walkers and Other Products

he U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission CPSC) knows of incidents in which young children eeled off and choked on plastic labels and decals om baby walkers. The CPSC also has reports of oung children choking on plastic labels and decals om other products. Fortunately none of these incients resulted in deaths but the potential exists for a agedy to occur.

Parents and other child care providers are strong] urged to pull off and throw away all plastic labels and decals from baby walkers and other juvenile products to prevent choking. However, do not remove permanent paper warning labels. Parents also should throw away loose plastic labels and decals from other products to which the children may have access.
