Sealed separate bids for consultant services for a two-phase feasibility study and formation of regional Stormwater Utility District(s) will be received by Thomas R. Hersey, Jr., Erie County Department of Environment and Planning, 95 Franklin Street, Room 1077, Buffalo, New York 14202 through September 22, 2008 until 2:00 p.m. local time.

Phase I will include development of a scope of work and preliminary feasibility study for the formation of Stormwater Utility District(s) in Erie and Niagara Counties. The primary intent of the districts is to provide long term funding for the Stormwater Management Programs of 43 regulated municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) owners and operators in the urbanized area of Western New York. Phase II of the feasibility study will include the formation of the Stormwater Utility District(s) and will be commenced only after successful completion of Phase I objectives, and negotiation of the scope and fees for Phase II.

GUIDELINES FOR PROPOSALS



ERIE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT & PLANNING

STORMWATER UTILITY DISTRICT(S) FORMATION FEASIBILITY STUDY

The Erie County Department of Environment and Planning (ECDEP) is seeking proposals from consultants who wish to be evaluated and considered to assist the Western New York Stormwater Coalition (WNYSC) in the study, and later the formation of a Stormwater Utility District(s) (SUD(s)). The awarded contract will include two phases. The first phase (Phase I) will commence upon an approved contract, and shall be completed by March 30, 2009. At the completion of Phase I, it will be determined whether the second phase (Phase II) will be undertaken.

BACKGROUND

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, in accordance with Federal Clean Water Act legislation, has issued regulations regarding municipal stormwater management. These regulations, referred to as the Phase II Stormwater regulations, establish significant new requirements for municipalities and other entities that own and manage separate storm sewer systems. One requirement of the regulations is to implement long-term funding mechanisms to sustain and maintain a Stormwater Management Program.

There are 29 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s) in Erie County and 10 MS4s in Niagara County that are subject to the regulations due to their location within a designated U.S. Census-defined Urbanized Area. Additionally, Erie and Niagara Counties, as well as two non-traditional MS4s, are also subject to these regulations. These MS4s established the WNYSC and are working cooperatively to meet the Stormwater Phase II long-term funding mechanism requirements. A list of the regulated municipalities, along with an identified stormwater contact person, is attached (Attachment 1).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project will consist of two phases. At the conclusion of Phase I of the Feasibility Study, the WNYSC will determine whether or not Phase II will be commenced.

- Phase I will focus on the development of a scope of work and preliminary feasibility study for the formation of a SUD(s) for the municipalities and regulated MS4s of Erie and Niagara Counties. The consultant will present and market the formation of the SUD(s) to the elected officials and decision makers on the municipal and county levels.
- Phase II will be dependent upon execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to secure commitment by all regulated municipalities to pursue the formation of county-wide SUD(s). It is our intent to award Phase II to the successful applicant for Phase I, subject to the conclusion of successful negotiations regarding scope and cost. Erie County reserves the right to terminate the contract if a satisfactory Phase II cannot be negotiated.

The services provided by the consultant may include (but are not limited to) engineering, legal and personal services to support the WNYSC with special expertise and experience.

It is important that the preliminary feasibility study provide enough detailed, municipal boundary specific data to clearly articulate this concept to the aforementioned officials, communities and decision makers so that the WNSYC may arrive at an informed decision on whether to commence with Phase II of the feasibility study.

Phase I - Preliminary Feasibility Study: Objectives

The preliminary feasibility study must minimally include (but is not limited to) the following items:

1. Coordinate needs assessment with regulated MS4s /WNYSC members, elected officials and other stakeholders and agencies within the project area, as identified on the attached schedule (Attachment 2).
2. Identify existing political boundaries and regulated areas within the MS4s to propose appropriate boundaries for one or two SUD(s) in Erie and Niagara Counties. Present the advantages and disadvantages of each concept (i.e., County-wide, individual regulated MS4s only, entire political municipal boundary, or other plan as may be formulated) including steps that would be required to achieve adoption of such SUD(s) concept.
3. Utilize the results of 2 case studies and any additional information to support the proposed methods for forming a SUD(s), with specific description of the intent and how individual MS4s will benefit from formation of a SUD(s).

Phase I - Preliminary Feasibility Study: Scope of Work

Develop a preliminary feasibility study (gross analysis) for consideration by decision makers. This study will include (but is not limited to) the items listed in “Phase I Preliminary Feasibility Study Objectives”. The scope of work for developing the preliminary feasibility study should include (but will not be limited to):

1. Meet with WNYSC staff to discuss an approach for meeting the objectives of the preliminary feasibility study.
2. Assess and inventory existing resources and identify expenses associated with operating and sustaining a compliant Stormwater Management Program and determine ongoing infrastructure and operating needs to maintain SUD(s) in Erie and Niagara Counties.
3. Conduct an MS4 by MS4 inventory of existing stormwater infrastructure to be included in the SUD(s) as well as the current stormwater budgets for each MS4 to result in a universal formula to determine an estimated cost/mile of storm sewer.
4. Assess potential SUD(s) revenue that could be generated.
5. Describe methods of assessment (including rates, general facility charges, usage fees and incentive rebate credits) and recommend billing program for a SUD(s) in Erie and Niagara Counties
6. Identify all major regional stormwater-related water quality and environmental concerns to support the need for the resources that would be made available through creation of SUD(s).
7. Meet with decision makers at the counties and municipalities to discuss the storm water utility feasibility. Utilize appropriate cases studies information.
8. Formulate and conduct an outreach program to secure commitment by all regulated municipalities to pursue the formation of county-wide SUD(s).
9. Develop a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which states the approach (scope) for the full feasibility analysis and the level of commitment by counties and municipalities involved in the scoping process.

Phase II - Development of a Stormwater Utility District(s) and Administrative Structure: Objectives

The Program Objectives for Phase II should include (but not be limited to):

1. Implement the recommendations and conclusions of the Phase I Feasibility Study
2. Establish SUD(s) in the regulated MS4s in Erie and Niagara Counties.
3. Establish a permanent funding source structure to support the ongoing costs associated with managing a compliant Phase II Stormwater Permit program and provide adequate resources to address stormwater-related capital improvements and special projects.
4. Provide the legal, technical and administrative assistance required to successfully create SUD(s) in Erie and Niagara Counties.

**Phase II – Development of a Stormwater Utility District(s) and Administrative Structure:
Scope of Work**

The Scope of Work for Phase II should include (but not be limited to):

1. Provide appropriate coordination among WNYSC members.
2. Determine final boundaries for the SUD(s) based on work completed under Phase I.
3. Obtain stormwater facilities and conveyance system mapping information that is currently available from all of the regulated entities and compile it into a single system for each SUD(s).
4. Prepare a revenue requirement analysis for the stormwater utility based on an estimate of annual expenses.
5. Identify and recommend methods for allocating and distributing the resources created by the establishment of SUD(s) to support, including but not limited to:
 - Overall SUD(s) administration
 - MS4 Stormwater Management Plan(s) implementation
 - Capital improvements
 - Special projects
6. Develop the criteria and parameters for Capital Improvement Program(s) (CIPs) to annually select projects and allocate annual capital improvement funds for the SUD(s). A preliminary CIP(s) should also be provided based on the established criteria as well as the initial improvements identified by the regulated entities and recommendations by the consultant.
7. Complete an analysis to determine the policy choices necessary to establish the stormwater billing rate and the method of assessment.
8. Identify and recommend methods of billing for discussion.
9. Prepare a public education and involvement program in conjunction with the WNYSC. Assist with and participate in hearings for the general public to help the community understand and support the formation of the SUD(s).
10. Provide a final, comprehensive report to the WNYSC detailing all of the methodology, structure and implementation steps to be taken to develop a SUD(s), encompassing all of the Phase I and Phase II objectives set forth herein, including conclusions and recommendations to implement a SUD(s) in Erie and Niagara Counties.

PROPOSAL FORMAT

Submittals should include the following in the order shown:

1. Letter of interest (One page maximum)
2. Project experience specifically related to developing a Stormwater Utility District. (3 projects minimum)

3. References for the proposed Project Manager. (Three references minimum)
4. Detailed resumes of individual team members
5. General outline of the recommended steps for developing a Stormwater Utility District(s)
6. Full cost proposal for Phase I and Phase II work including an estimate of man hours, staffing table, salary information and overhead rates.
7. Plan to address MBE/ WBE requirements

EVALUATION

The consultant will be selected based on **experience, qualifications and cost**. A consultant selection committee comprised of members of the WNYSC and ECDEP staff will evaluate all proposals to select a firm. The proposals will be comparatively evaluated based upon the requirements stated in the body of this RFP. Interviews will be conducted only if deemed necessary.

The selected firm will be invited by the ECDEP to enter into a Stormwater Utility District(s) Formation Services Agreement.

The Stormwater Utility District(s) Formation Services Agreement for **Phase I** will be valid through March 30, 2009 at which time it will be determined whether to commence with **Phase II**. Erie County reserves the option to renew the agreements periodically thereafter.

PROJECT DURATION

A contract awarded for Phase I will be for an approximate five-month period. Phase II will be for an approximate six-month period.

Applicants must demonstrate recent relevant experience, strong background in stormwater engineering, stormwater permit management and financial matters, and strong communication skills.

A **project information meeting** will be held on **Thursday, September 4, 2008 at 10:00 a.m.** in the Department of Environment and Planning conference room (room 1004), 10th floor of the Erie County Rath Building, 95 Franklin St., Buffalo, New York

SUBMISSION

The Proposal shall not exceed twenty-five (25) pages, double sided (printed on both sides) or fifty (50) pages, single sided (printed on one side). Sectional dividers may be used; they will not be counted toward the maximum number of pages allowed. A one-page cover letter may also be included, which will not be

counted toward the maximum number of pages allowed. The proposal shall include a concise table of contents addressing all the requirements of the RFP. These requirements will be strictly enforced.
