
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY
ON THE REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION OF JOINT PHYSICAL AND LEGAL
CUSTODY IN FAMILY COURT CHILD CUSTODY PROCEEDINGS.

1 WHEREAS, Senate Resolution No. 10, Regular Session of 2007,
2 authorized the Senate Committee on Human Services and Public
3 Housing to conduct interim hearings on matters related to family
4 court child custody proceedings; and

5
6 WHEREAS, the purpose of these interim hearings was to
7 provide all interested parties with access and information
8 related to the family court system and child custody
9 proceedings; and

10
11 WHEREAS, the interim hearings addressed the issue of shared
12 parenting through joint legal and physical custody with the
13 focus on what the best interest of the child would be; and

14
15 WHEREAS, shared parenting allows the parents and children
16 substantial contact and residential time together and this may
17 provide an opportunity for parents to amicably resolve child
18 custody issues between each other; and

19
20 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this State to assure that
21 minor children have continued contact with their parents who
22 have shown the ability to act in their child's best interest and
23 to encourage parents to share in the rights and responsibilities
24 of rearing their children after the parents have separated or
25 dissolved their marriage; and

26
27 WHEREAS, during the course of these interim hearings,
28 several working groups were established and they submitted their
29 findings and recommendations to the larger task force; and

30
31 WHEREAS, the task force adopted the recommendations of the
32 working groups which were later implemented by the Legislature,



1 however, there were other issues that the task force was unable
2 to explore fully; and

3
4 WHEREAS, one issue the task force did not explore is the
5 presumption of joint physical and legal custody of a minor
6 child, in a divorce proceeding, where there is a rebuttable
7 presumption that parents should equally share in the physical
8 and legal parenting of the child; and

9
10 WHEREAS, being unable to fully explore and discuss the
11 presumption of joint physical and legal custody, the task force
12 members are interested in exploring how other states have
13 responded to this issue and whether our State should adopt
14 similar legislation; now, therefore,

15
16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
17 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
18 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative
19 Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study on the
20 presumption of joint or shared physical and legal custody in
21 family court child custody proceedings; and

22
23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include:

- 24
25 (1) A review and comparison of the other states' and
26 countries' statutes and laws relating to the
27 presumption of joint or shared physical and legal
28 child custody;
- 29
30 (2) A review of studies conducted, if any, on the impact
31 of the use of the presumption of joint or shared
32 physical and legal child custody in contested and non-
33 contested cases;
- 34
35 (3) A review of current Hawaii case law on the use of the
36 foregoing presumptions and the applicable standards of
37 proof; and
- 38
39 (4) A review of data regarding joint physical and legal
40 custody requests in family court proceedings in
41 Hawaii, which resulted in either a temporary or
42 permanent court order, involving both contested and
43 non-contested cases; and


